#### **ATTENDANT CARE/SHELTER CARE**

Attendant Care is the constant supervision of a juvenile by a trained attendant in a non-physical secure setting. Attendant Care is designed for juveniles who are inappropriate for shelter care or because the behavior warrants greater structure. Youth are housed at the Bureau anywhere from a few hours to several days.

Shelter Care is temporary care during which a child needs a safe bed outside of the home. Placement must be made by an appropriate agency. Sunrise Youth Bureau is certified for ages 10-17 and can have no more than 6 children at a time.

## **DIVERSION/CRISIS INTERVENTION PROGRAM**

The Sunrise Youth Bureau Diversion program provides an opportunity for youth to avoid a hearing in juvenile court. The purpose is to keep youth from entering the juvenile justice system, while still being held accountable for their actions. The Sunrise Youth Bureau is able to provide programming and supervision to the youth, while being a support system to the youth and their family. The Sunrise Youth Bureau believes that early intervention during crisis situations is an opportunity for positive change. Staff provides immediate intervention and assessment for family conflicts, legal issues and youth related mental health issues. The SYB is available to assist law enforcement agencies, schools, parents and youth in crisis.
