Mr. President, Commissioners, I am pleased to appear before you today to ask you to consider giving your approval to the nomination of Natalie Birchak to the Dickinson Historic Preservation Commission. As you will recall, one of the responsibilities of a Certified Local Government is that we "maintain a qualified historic preservation commission" whose members preferably possess professional qualifications in history, architectural history, archeology, anthropology, curation, planning, landscape architecture or related fields or who have a personal interest in historic preservation.

In addition to her degree, Natalie is an EPA certified Class C Fuel Operator and has worked as an airport Line Technician. She is also a licensed pilot and is pursuing an Instrument Rating. Lastly, since shortly after arriving in Dickinson, Natalie has also taken it upon herself to attend Historic Preservation Commission meetings in order to learn more about our community and its historic resources.

At this time the Dickinson Historic Preservation Commission asks the Dickinson City Commission that Natalie Birchak be considered for membership on the Historic Preservation Commission, to begin an initial three-year term at the Commission's January meeting.
