2025 ROAD MAINTENANCE PROJECT - SID RESOLUTION 202501-2

For your consideration is a Resolution determining the protests of the 2025 Road Maintenance Special Improvement District 202501-2. This district was established at the September 17, 2024 Commission Meeting with approval by this board of Resolution 39-2024.

The protest period for the project, as required by the North Dakota Century Code, ended on October 25, 2024. A total number and overall percental of the protests are provided below. These protests did not meet the statutory requirement to bar the City from proceeding with the special improvement project.

- Total Area of Protests = 87,969 Square Feet
- Total Area in the SID = 255,544 Square Feet
- Area Percentage = 34%
- Total Number of Protests = 3
- Total Number of Properties in the SID = 9
- Properties Percentage = 33%

Pursuant to ND Century Code 40-22-18, properties owned by political subdivisions are not included in the district area total. One parcel in this district is owned by the Dickinson Parks and Recreation, and was not factored into the Total Area in the SID.

The project benefits are listed below:

• The streets, curb and gutter, and sidewalks need repairs. Several of the sidewalks are not ADA compliant. These improvements will ensure safe pedestrian walkability and access throughout the neighborhood. The street improvements will extend the life expectancy of the roadways and will reduce maintenance costs for the City.

The total project construction cost is estimated to be \$7.62 million, which will be funded through a combination of special assessments and City funds. The total assessment estimate for the project is *\$31,747.60* as per the engineering report. The assessment amount will be included in property taxes and paid back over 10 years at an interest rate of 5.4%. Those who pay their assessments in full by October 1, 2026, will not be charged interest or penalties.





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If this resolution is approved by the City Commission, engineering staff will proceed with finalizing the project plans and specification, and the project will be put out to bid.

Engineering staff recommend approval.
