•Once finished, the updated facilities will enhance the student learning experience and provide upgraded training and competition spaces that strengthen the university's academic and athletic programs.

·Woods Hall – ready for fall 2026

•Residence Hall Occupancy – occupancy is at 89%-100% across all residence halls

·351/374 total beds filled

·23 open beds due to medical & accessibility needs






DSU's Impact on Dickinson
