

ORIGINAL LOG PIONEER HOME “CHALUPA” (CZECH COTTAGE)



In the winter of 1869, Frank Wampol came to Dakota Territory and constructed

this log home.

This pioneer log home is built in the style of an old country cottage called a “Chalupa,” where the people lived and provided shelter for livestock. This would include a team of oxen or

horses, perhaps a cow and poultry in one room. The center room was the kitchen, and the other room was a combination master bedroom and living room. The children slept upstairs with the heat from the animals keeping them warm.

This building was moved to the park in 1982 from its original location, one mile south and one half mile west of Tabor.
