Re: Rubble Site – Fuel Surcharge

Monday, May 9th, 2022, at 9AM the three Cities (Deadwood, Lead, and Central City) met with the operators of the Tri-City Rubble Site (Adams Salvage Recycling and Recovery) to discuss the addition of a fuel surcharge to the fees imposed on the residential and commercial customers of the Tri-City Rubble Site.

After a lengthy discussion and evidence provided by the operator of actual costs of receiving materials, the three cities and the operator agreed to the following terms if approved by the three cities.

- The Cities will not be charged a fuel surcharge for City vehicles.
- Fuel Surcharge will not be assessed during free dump weekends or during the tri-city free clean-up week.
- Fuel Surcharge will not be added to loads of brush, metal, or compost
- Residential Pick-up Loads will pay an additional \$5.00 Fuel Surcharge Fee
- Commercial Vehicles will pay an additional \$7.00 Fuel Surcharge Fee
- If the price of fuel drops below \$4.00 a gallon for thirty (30) consecutive days, the fuel surcharge will be removed from the fee schedule

Recommended Motion: Move to approve/deny the proposed fuel surcharge fee for residential and commercial vehicles as \$5.00 per residential vehicle and \$7.00 per commercial vehicle with the conditions stated above.
