




'Instruments of the Era'

The history of music for gold-seekers during the Wild West was abundant in variety. The fiddle, banjo, lyre, harp, 6- and 8-string acoustic and parlor guitars all played roles at the turn of the 20th century. Specifically, this dynamic Orville Gibson F Model Mandolin was produced between 1898 and early 1900's. At just under 41" in length, the hand crafted and curved 3-piece construction are signatures of its beauty and uniqueness and help symbolize the impact music had at this time as one of the instruments of the era.




