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68 3. Dent R. Kirkland, Public Works Director, Public Works Update

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71 Public Works Director Kirkland provided a Public Works update to the Council. They have been  
72 preparing the park for the car show. The D on the water tower is lit; Colton Chappell donated the  
73 lights, and they put magnets on them. Mayor Niles remarked that they were sent a thank you card  
74 with a gift card. Kirkland is hoping to patch 750 North next week and put a shoulder in. They have been  
75 test-patching and resurfacing the skate park to see what will work best to fix it. Fuel sales have been  
76 abundant at the airport. Kirkland has been in contact with Armstrong about the asphalt preservation  
77 project this year.

78 **ADDITIONAL ITEMS**

79 Council Member Western asked about the plans for the eclipse on October 14<sup>th</sup>. Matt Ward remarked  
80 there could be upwards of 150,000 in Millard and Sevier Counties that day.

81 Mayor Niles has tried contacting M&J Electric about the pickleball courts. They have ordered lights and  
82 pedestals. Rocky Mountain Power donated a check for \$4500 for the pickleball courts.

83 Mayor Niles talked with the janitorial staff, and they are uninterested in taking on cleaning the library.  
84 Michelle Lovejoy and Rebecca Peterson will work on creating a help-wanted advertisement and  
85 conducting interviews under the advisement of Mayor Niles.
