Goods and/or Services: This agreement provides a maximum of \$2,890,046 funding to Deschutes County Health Services (DCHS), a Behavioral Health Resource Network (BHRN) provider, ensuring increased access to care for communities. The agreement is effective through December 31, 2023.

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Background & History: In November 2020, Oregon voters passed Measure 110, the Drug Addiction Treatment and Recovery Act of 2020 (hereinafter referred to as "Measure 110"), to better serve people actively using substances or diagnosed with a substance use disorder. People who provide drug treatment and recovery services and advocate for criminal justice reform wrote Measure 110 in response to the high rate of drug addiction and overdoses in Oregon, and the disproportionate impact of those outcomes on Oregon's communities of color and tribal communities. Their goal was to establish a more equitable and effective approach to substance use disorder treatment.

Measure 110 centers on equity, based on the knowledge that some communities are disproportionately harmed by laws that criminalize drug possession. Measure 110 makes health assessment, low-barrier access to care, low barrier treatment, harm reduction, and recovery services available to all those who need and want access to those services, and will make it a priority to provide additional support and assistance to people and communities who experience a higher burden of disease. Measure 110 established the Oversight and Accountability Council (OAC) which grants funds and approves grants for providers and services who meet the criteria for a Behavioral Health Resource Network (BHRN).

BHRN is a system of interconnected providers working together to ensure an increase in access to care for all communities, including those disproportionately impacted by rates of incarceration. BHRNs provide services to all in need of treatment and support for substance use concerns, including but not limited to: housing, harm reduction, peer support, supported employment and substance use disorder treatment. All services provided through these networks must be evidence-informed, trauma informed, culturally and linguistically specific and responsive, person-centered, nonjudgmental, and free of charge to clients. Deschutes County Health Services (DCHS) has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with five (5) treatment providers to establish the Deschutes County BHRN.

Funds will be disbursed in quarterly payment of \$481,674.35, in accordance with the schedule outlined in Exhibit A. Data collection and reporting is required.
