PATROL

 Officer Martin Gardiner has returned to Dillingham after spending 17 weeks at the Public Safety Academy in Sitka. When he started in July there were 34 recruits in his class. The recruits were a mix of state troopers, municipal police officers, park rangers, and VPSOs. Only 25 of the recruits graduated the academy. Officer Gardiner received the Defensive Tactics award for excelling in that area of training.

- The rotational officers are now able to work independently. They are all experienced
 officers and are adapting very easily to policing in Dillingham.
- This is greatly reducing the amount of over-work performed by the resident officers. We currently have 3 resident positions and 4 rotational positions.
- We have one vacant resident officer position and are advertising to fill it.

DISPATCH

- Dispatch is fully staffed.
- We hired a new dispatcher, Kathy Yukluk-Solis. She is currently in training.
- We have started providing 1800 hour radio checks once again for the new EMS teams.
 Having an operational EMS and Fire Department has immensely lowered the stress level of our dispatchers.

CORRECTIONS

- We hired a new corrections officer, Saundra Larson. She has been trained and is now working shifts on her own.
- Having three trained COs means that police officers no longer have to perform double duty by watching the inmates in the jail. Unfortunately, having only three COs means that they have to work overtime to cover the jail 24/7.
- We still have 2 vacant corrections officer positions and are advertising to fill them.
