2	AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DOUGLAS, COCHISE COUNTY, ARIZONA, AMENDING ORDINANCE
3	NO. 08-938 AND AMENDING THE DOUGLAS MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 2, CHAPTER 2.02 RELATING TO CITY COUNCIL BY
4	AMENDING SECTION 2.02.010 MEETINGS-TIME, PLACE AND QUORUM; ESTABLISHING SEVERABILITY OF COMPONENTS OF ORDINANCE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE
5	THEREOF.
6	WHEREAS, the City of Douglas council deems it necessary to adjust the meeting time and after due consideration, it has been determined that a change in the meeting time would better accommodate the needs of the residents and officials;
7	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Douglas, Arizona, as follows:
8 9	SECTION 1: AMENDMENT OF MEETING TIME. Section 2.02.010, Meetings-Time, Place and Quorum is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
10	Regular council meetings will be held on the second Wednesday of each month in the Council Chamber, Douglas City Hall, Douglas, Arizona beginning at five p.m. When the regular meeting date falls on a day which is a legal holiday recognized as such by the city, the mayor shall designate another business day during the calendar
11	month as the date upon which the regular meeting shall occur for that month. If it appears to the mayor that a quorum will not be present at any regular monthly meeting, the mayor shall set another business day during the
12	calendar month for the regular meeting of the mayor and council. Whenever the regular monthly meeting does not occur on the second Wednesday of the month and another date is chosen, reasonable advance notice of the new
13	date and time shall be given to the public in accordance with state statute.
14 15	SECTION 2: IMPLEMENTATION. The City Clerk is hereby directed to take all necessary actions to ensure that the revised meeting time of five p.m. is appropriately publicized and implemented. Notice of this change shall be posted on the city's website and any other relevant platforms.
16	SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any chapter, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
