EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff and the community recently learned that the remains of Private Felix M. Yanez, one of the other "missing three" Douglas, Arizona natives who served in the Korean War, were identified on July 13, 2022 through dental and DNA analysis. Mr. Yanez was laid to rest in Tucson, AZ on September 3, 2022.

BACKGROUND:

On June 8, 2022, Mayor & Council Approved Resolution No. 22-1503, a citizen request to name a city facility after US Army SGT Frank G. Vejar. Prior to the meeting at which that approval happened, City Manager was approached by family members of Sgt Vejar, requesting to honor three others who were friends of Sgt Vejar and still missing in action. (PV2 Felix M. Yanez, Cpl Gerardo R. Aldaña and Sgt. Richard C. Encinas)

DISCUSSION:

Due to the identification of PV2 Yanez's remains, City staff would still like to honor SFC Vejar, PV2 Yanez and the still missing soldiers from Douglas, AZ by appropriately naming the Veterans Park Playground. Staff recommends the change from "SFC Frank G. Vejar and the missing three" to "Korean War Heroes Memorial"
