Granted Crosswalk Art Project

- Adriana "Bibi" Harris approached the City Manager and staff to discuss possible support for a community art grant project to improve one crosswalk location in Douglas with colorful paints following the vision of the artists.
- The Arts Foundation for Tucson and Southern Arizona is funding \$2,000 for materials and artists.









Connecting Pedestrian Safety, Wayfinding and Community Healing through Public Art

- Historical, cultural, specific place-based art, and artistic creative license in design were discussed for other potential crosswalks.
- City staff asked questions of Ms. Harris and discussed if the project could be replicated with more public involvement in either the design or painting.
- City staff proposed expanding the concept to multiple crosswalks to support school-aged children walking and bicycling to and from Borane Middle School in light of the tragic truck-on-bicycle accident on February 10, 2022 that took the life of Bryan Chacon, a 12-year old resident of Agua Prieta who attended Ray Borane Middle School as a 6th grader.




Crosswalk Art Project/Bryan's Way Policy Support Highlights:


- Transit/Circulation (TC)-Circulation Safety (CS) GOAL 2: Promote circulation safety throughout the City.
 - TC-CS Objective 2-1: Support an effective, well-planned system of roadways that establishes a functional, safe, and aesthetic hierarchy of streets and incorporates multimodal access.
 - TC-CS Policy 2-1c: Promote convenient multimodal access to public places having high concentration of trips, including the airport, schools, parks, recreation areas, monuments, historic sites and attractions, U.S./Mexico ports of entry, major community gateways, the Golf Club and the Central Business District.
 - TC-CS Policy 2-1f: Integrate vehicular circulation within neighborhoods to improve bicycle and pedestrian connectivity to key destinations, including recreation areas, adjacent services, transit facilities, and schools.




Potential Bryan's Way Alignment
