SUBJECT: **BID AWARD** to LAYNE CHRISTENSEN CO. Using City of Tucson Job Order Contract #171754

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff was directed to seek quotes for an equipment assessment for possible rehabilitation of Well 14. This work was to be completed using the City of Tucson current Job Order Contract # 171754. Stantec Consulting provided a Scope of Work for the mentioned rehabilitation project. Request for Quotes were sent to three (3) contractors. Layne Christensen Co., Yellow Jacket Drilling and Geomechanics Southwest. On February 25, 2022, one (1) proposal was received from Layne Christensen Co with a cost of \$129,878.33.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Douglas is progressing with varying alternatives to provide additional water supply to the City's municipal distribution system demands. Well 14 was identified as a possible water source for the City. Well 14 is located on the west side of the City near Oak Avenue and N County Hospital Road and was completed in 1994 to 500 feet depth with 16-inch casing throughout but was decommissioned following several years of operation due to arsenic water quality issues. This rehab will help to evaluate mechanical, hydraulic, and water quality data to determine the feasibility of bringing this well back online with an Arsenic Media Treatment Process.

DISCUSSION:

Staff recommends awarding the contract to Layne Christensen Co. for the Rehabilitation of Well 14.
