RESOLUTION NO. 24-1597

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF DOUGLAS, COCHISE COUNTY, ARIZONA,
APPROVING THE TERMINATION OF THE NOVEMBER 26,
1979, PROPERTY MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE CITY OF DOUGLAS AND THE CITY OF
DOUGLAS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.**

WHEREAS, the City of Douglas and the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) entered into a Property Management Agreement on November 26, 1979, as part of receiving grant funds for the construction and equipping of an industrial building and the City of Douglas Industrial Development Authority (IDA) became successor of all rights of the Property Management Agreement from the EDA of the Property Management Agreement on May 8, 1991; and

WHEREAS, the city and the IDA have collaborated in the development of an industrial park on 11th Street west of Pan American; and

WHEREAS, the IDA has entered into contract to sell the parcel for private development and the Property Management Agreement is no longer necessary between the City of Douglas and the IDA after the sale of the parcel is completed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Douglas, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1. That the Termination of the Property Management Agreement, a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk is accurate, comprehensive, and complete and is hereby approved.

Section 2. The City Manager and the City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Termination of the Property Management Agreement (attached as Exhibit A) on behalf of the City of Douglas.

Section 3. The officers of the City Council and the City of Douglas are hereby authorized and directed to fulfill all obligations under the terms of the agreement.
