Doris Ford Webb is a native of the Douglas, Arizona community, who has continued to go the extra mile for not only those whom she helps within her healthcare profession, but for members of the community as well. Volunteering with operation Santa for Senior Citizens in the community through SEAGO has been a highlight of her volunteer work in which she provides warm items like blankets, gloves, scarfs, socks bundled together and gifted to the community and elderly. From 2015 to 2018, Doris participated in the Back-to-School Care Fair which allows children of the community to gather essential materials needed for the following school year. Doris was elected Vice President of the Douglas Area Food Bank from 2011 to 2019 and since 2013 during the holiday season when times can be tough, she continues to help with the Toys for Tots program and coordinating with the Douglas Fire Department to hand baskets of food to help make the holidays a family memory for years to come.

Mayor Huish provided a certificate of appointment to Ms. Stricklen.

7. PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION:

A. **PRESENTATION** by Mr. Gabriel A. Cruz from CRUZ FARM & FINCA COLIBRI: Educational Farm and Creative Space; Pasture Raised Hens Egg Production and Garlic Pilot Program in Douglas, AZ.

Mayor Huish stated Mr. Cruz is a proud Bulldog, came back home and wanting to invest in the community. Additionally, Mayor Huish mentioned Mr. Cruz has exiting things for the community.

Mr. Gabriel Cruz with Cruz Farm, borned and raised in Douglas, Arizona, graduated in 2001. Mr. Cruz mentioned he was involved in 4H program and participated in Future Farmers of America and is one of the few able to participate from age 5 up until 18 years old involved in Agriculture. Additionally, Mr. Cruz mentioned he went to UofA and was heavily involved in Agriculture and graduated with a degree in Agriculture and Economics. Mr. Cruz added he had worked in Latin America, Mexico City, consulted multinationals in Europe, worked in London, Paris, and in the Middle East which spent time in Dubai, and Lebenon.

Mr. Cruz expressed that Cruz Farm has become one of the largest pasteurized operations in the United States. Mr. Cruz presented on the following points:

Mayor Huish expressed it was amazing that exist nort of town on Leslie Canyon Road, and added many possibilities and project is exciting. Mayor Huish stated a young man accomplishing things around the world.

Council Member Acosta mentioned it was an amazing program, and shared her background of growing up in California which is all agriculture and cattleranching community. Additionally, Council Member Acosta wondered what could be done locally, farming and ranching, but it was awesome and commended Mr. Cruz.

Mr. Cruz added the intent was to collaborate with FFA and get students involved to influence and inspire them.

Council Member Acosta mentioned sometimes kids don't know where food come from, and being self sufficient in the area and become more sustainable as well was something they needed to know.

Council Member Lindemann complimented Mr. Cruz and thanked him for the presentation. Council Member Lindemann also shared he has farming background.

Council Member Shelton stated it was great to have Mr. Cruz back in Douglas. Council Member Shelton inquired if Mr. Cruz talked to Douglas High School teachers and presented his vision.

In response, Mr. Cruz stated it was his first time presenting to the Community.

Council Member Shelton asked if Cruz Farm was raising in Leslie Canyon Road.

Mr. Cruz agreed and mentioned it would become the Headquarter.

Council Member Grijalva thanked Mr. Cruz for being an inspiration to young people and thanked him for his charcter.

Council Member Acosta mentioned all her family was from Rio Sonora.

Mayor Huish thanked Mr. Cruz for his presentation.

Mayor Huish took the opportunity to invite "Stewart" Farm to present on a project also north of Douglas, at a future council work session meeting.

Mr. Stewart mentioned they were working on networking and making an opportunity for things to change in the future.

B. CDBG-CV Presentation by Mr. Anthony Reed, Executive Director of the United Way of Sierra Vista and Cochise County, and CDBG Active Projects presentation by Xenia Gonzalez, CDBG Administrator.

Xenia Gonzalez provided background information on Corona Virus Act. The City of Douglas received two rounds of fundind for Corona Virus Relief and opted to partner with United Way of Sierra Vista, Mr. Reed is the Executive Director, to disburse funds in the community.

Mr. Anthony Reed provided background information on his time in Douglas as a Teacher, then a Principal for PPEP Tech High School in Douglas. Mr. Reed also introduced Kevin Westin-United Way Board Member.

Mr. Reed mentioned the actual grant agreement funds were \$143,293 dolars, and continued to say that the initial CDBG funds totaled \$95,500; an additional \$47,793 was added for a total of \$145,683.

Mr. Reed added the funds distribution was as follows:

- Rent/Utilities Assistance (\$45,300)
- Food Assistance (\$25,400)
- COVID Testing/Administration (\$67,818)
- Administrative Fees (\$7,165)

Mr. Reed provided the following information:

Rent/Utilities

- Partnered with St. Vincent de Paul-Douglas
 - Assisted 1,248 persons, 428 families including 573 children
 - 126 persons were Single Females/Head of Household

Food Assistance

- Initially partnered with DARC (Meals on Wheels) & Douglas Area Food Bank
- Fed more than 400 local families and stacked and provided much-needed food boxes for local smaller non-profits and churches
- 19 persons were Elderly Females

Mr. Reed mentioned the Douglas Area Food Bank didn't take the funds for food assistance. COVID-19 Testing

- Partnered with Chricahua Community Health Center
- Provided 911 COVID tests for community members
- After vaccine became available, CDBG funds covered administrative costs for COVID vaccine shots for 814 community members

Administrative Fees

- United Way charged the City of Douglas 5% of total CDBG amount
- Ensured all funds were distributed per agreement
- Provided monthly accountability of all funds
- Worked diligently with City of Douglas when changes had to made based on community needs

Mr. Reed stated on behalf of the United Way of Sierra Vista Board of Directors, thank the City of Douglas for allowing them to partner with the City to help the community members in dire straits throughout this pandemic.

Council Member Acosta thanked Mr. Reed for his and mentioned Chiricahua Community Health Center was the only facility conducting COVID testing in the county. Additionally, Council Member Acosta stated there was no conflict of interest in allocating funds for Chiricahua, and thanked Ms. Gonzalez for her hard work as well.

Xenia Gonzalez also thanked Mr. Reed for being easy and flexible to work with. Ms. Gonzalez presented on the following points: CDBG Update, Active Projects, Consolidated Plan 2019-2023.


