**SUBJECT:** **RESOLUTION NO. 25-1653**, a Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the City of Douglas, Cochise County, Arizona, **AUTHORIZING** the City of Douglas to **ACCEPT GRANT FUNDING** and **ENTER** into a **SUBGRANTEE AGREEMENT** with the **STATE OF ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY** for a **REIMBURSABLE GRANT FUND** allocation in the amount of \$390,300 for **PERSONNEL OVERTIME** and **MILEAGE COSTS** under **OPERATION STONEGARDEN FISCAL YEAR 2024 ALLOCATION GRANT PROGRAM**.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The Arizona Department of Homeland Security selected the Department to receive \$390,300 in funding under the FFY 2024 Operation Stonegarden Award Allocation Grant Program. The performance period for this grant cycle is February 1, 2025 through March 31, 2026.

**BACKGROUND:**

The award amount is allocated as follows:

Overtime	\$292,329.47
ERE	\$58,670.53
Mileage	\$39,300.00

The Operation Stonegarden Program was implemented to enhance security along the nation's border regions. This is achieved through a cooperative and coordinated enforcement effort between state and local law enforcement agencies and the U.S. Border Patrol, targeting specific routes of egress that could potentially be used by criminal organizations to smuggle terrorists, weapons of mass destruction, and other contraband into the United States from Mexico.

The Police Department has participated in the Operation Stonegarden Program since its inception and to date all expenditures have been reimbursed in full.
