- 15) Temporary Fences Temporary Fences consisting of Deer Fence
- a) General Standards
 - 1. A zoning permit shall be required for all fences
 - 2. The applicant shall provide a survey of the property to determine the property location for the fence
 - 3. No Fence shall be permitted in the street right-of-way or easement.
- b) Not applicable: In zones other than for single- or two-family dwellings
 - 1. Not applicable Solid Board fence
- 2. Not applicable: Wrought iron, Open Mesh, Chain Link or Slatted fencing, provided that a minimum ratio of one part open space to six-parts of opaque fencing
 - 3. not applicable: Masonry Walls
- b) Sic Not applicable: In residential zones and where single or two family dwellings are the principle permitted uses
- c) Not applicable: Swimming Pools
- 15) New: Temporary Deer fences will be allowed:
 - 1. Consisting Deer Fence polyethylene black mesh
 - 2. No Fence may exceed to exceed six (6) feet above the lot line
 - 3. Posts, or Piers, Metal or Steel Stakes may be used not to exceed eight (8) feet apart
 - 4. Temporary is defined as until the Deer invasion is abated.
