Zoning: PDD-14 Single Family - 5 (262) Single Family - 3 (180) Local Retail Phase I improvements accepted. No active construction permits. Located Southeast of Highway 290 and Ranch Road 12 intersection and surrounded by a mix of residential and commercial.

Taylor Morrison is proposing a Master Sign Plan for Village Grove.

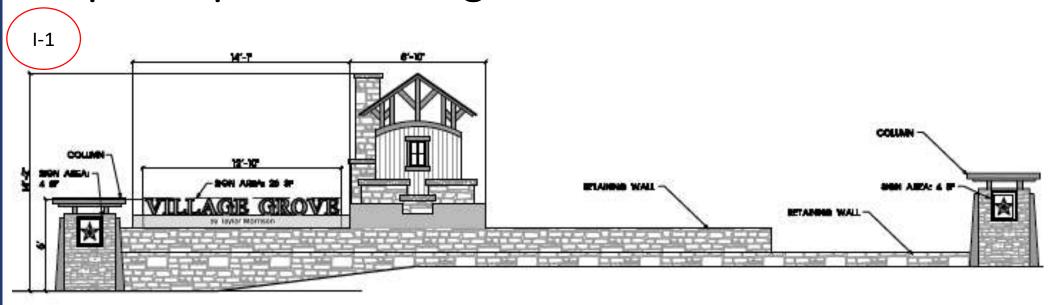
The project includes 2 flag poles and 25 total signs, 22 of which are temporary

The Master Sign Plan includes variances for the following: 26.02.001 - Residential Districts (iv) One additional Construction/Development sign Directional signs 26.04.008 – Additional Temporary Signs

21 additional temporary signs to remain through completion of the final phase of subdivision construction.

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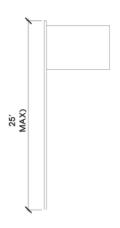














### Mitigation strategy

## Village Grove Master Sign Plan

- Applicant reduced heights on all temporary, off-premise, and secondary entry signs, and reduced the flagpole height.
- Landscaped area of the large community sign exceeds code requirements.



#### Variance Criteria

- Hardship claim based on the exceptional topographic conditions or physical features uniquely affecting the property on which a sign is to be located.
- Proposed sign location, configuration, design, materials and colors are harmonious with the hill country setting.
- Natural colors (earth tones) and muted colors are favored. Color schemes must be compatible with the surrounding structures. Predominate use of bold and/or bright colors is discouraged under this section.
- The sign and its supporting structure is in architectural harmony with the surrounding structures.

#### Variance Criteria

- 7. Demonstrated and documented correlation between the variance and protecting the public health and safety.
- 8. The stage at which the variance is requested. The city will be more inclined to consider a variance request when it is sought during an earlier stage of the construction approval process, for instance when the responsible party is submitting/obtaining a plat, planned unit development, development agreement, or site plan.
  - Whether the sign could have been included in a master signage plan. Master signage plans are highly encouraged. The city will be more inclined to favorably consider a variance request when the variance is part of a master signage plan. There will be a presumption against granting variances piecemeal, ad hoc, on a case-by-case basis when the sign for which a variance is sought could have been included in a master sign plan and considered in the course of a comprehensive review of the entire project's signage.
- 10. The sign administrator may authorize the remodeling, renovation, or alteration of a sign when some nonconforming aspect of the sign is thereby reduced.

#### **Staff Recommendation**

Parks and Recreation Commission has not discussed or approved the Village Grove/ Taylor Morrison sign being placed on the Sports & Recreation Park sign.

Staff recommends approval of the Master Sign Plan with the Village Grove/ Taylor Morrison sign approval pending PRC decision on 15 October.
