
#### **SUMMARY OF PRESENTATION**



#### **COYOTE KIDS NATURE CAMP: OVERHAUL**

- Continued strong transition to a nature and science-based approach to summer camp for Central Texas youths aged 5-11 years old (Aged expanded to meet growing need for younger care)
- Provided 10 weeks of specialized camp material, overseen and directed by DSRP Program
   Coordinator Madyson Sanchez and DSRP Program Specialist Katey Ewton
- Ewton introduced and oversaw scheduling for 3 themes/age group to be repeated throughout the summer with the recommended inclusion of weekly field trips for campers aged 8-11 years old
- Bobcat Bridge (8-9) and Horned Lizards (10-11) took part in 20 featured field trips to the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center, Jacob's Well Natural Area Westcave Discovery Center, LBJ Ranch State Park, and Reimer's Ranch, which resulted in growing partnerships with all entities.
- Alternatively, Armadillo Amigos (5-7) took local field trips to Sport & Recreation Park, Founder's

Park, and Charro Ranch Park with 2 pool visits per week.

- 10 Weeks of Programming at \$250/session + \$10 field trip fee/session
  - Maintained raised registration capacity of 60 campers from Summer 2024
  - 557 total participants throughout summer program; 93% capacity



#### **COYOTE KIDS NATURE CAMP: SURVEY RESULTS**

- Surveys sent out to parents/guardians bi-weekly throughout camp sessions
- Analyzed experience of both the adult and child, asked for feedback to improve the child's camp experience
- Continued to receive overwhelmingly positive results consistently throughout the program season
- Constructive comments and feedback were often easy to tackle quickly with surveys sent more frequently

"We love Ms. Katey and Ms. Madyson! The structure this year compared to last has been life changing for my son! He enjoys coming to camp everyday. Also, hiring Lily has been amazing. She is FANTASTIC with kids!"

"Thank you for offering a nature based camp that teaches the kids that there is so much more than what is on a screen."

"My camper reported being locked in the space between the bathroom and den for "an hour" although I'm not sure the accuracy on the time. He was nervous about it. I would recommend having a dedicated counselor make sure kiddos return from bathroom trips within a timely manner." "Maybe a little more updates... My son did really like it and he was happy but a little more updates especially when there are changes to schedules. Overall very happy, our son is happy. I didn't really see the main counselors much either. Schedule wise I think the snack times are spaced too close to lunch. Lunch came home uneaten most days."

  - Field Trip fees (+)
  - Updated marketing (+)
  - Open registration spots (-)
  - 15% Sibling Discount (-)
  - 20% Employee Discount (-)
  - \$3.3K Pool Fund Transfer (-)



#### **COYOTE KIDS NATURE CAMP: SUCCESSES**

- New and appropriate leadership changes allowed for structured sessions with division of age groups
- Counselors grouped and structured into appropriate levels of leadership and responsibility
  - Hours adjusted to accommodate staffing fund and support work-life balance
- Provided field trips weekly to each age group
  - Bobcat Brigade and Horned Lizards visited farther with \$10 required field trip fee
  - Alternatively, Armadillo Amigos took local field trips
- Strengthen relationship with Aquatics Manager Drew Hughes and attending lifeguards
- Policies and safety measures strengthened with new leadership and goals to achieve CAPRA and ACA accreditation









#### **COYOTE KIDS NATURE CAMP: GOALS**


- Achieve dedicated, sensory friendly, and divided programming space for camp hub
- Grow current program attendance for ages 10-15
- Restructure Counselor-in-Training to better meet camp needs and support teen growth, responsibility, and experience
- Adjust session pricing to meet program value and offset need for long summer session with the barrier of staff changes into start of academic season
- Brainstorm and structure Adventure Camps for children aging out of program and increase teen offerings
- Offer first annual Dripping Springs Camp Fair in February 2026




