July FMC Meeting:

FMC approved two of two vendor applications and declined an application that had been tabled at the April meeting.

July Market recap:

With a return to normal temps this year, July remained exceptionally strong. Against July of 2023, vendors averaged \$100 more and the market as a whole averaged \$3,500 more, and that with an average increase in customers per market of only 30 (they stay longer and spend more when it's comfortable). The new DSFM hats returned the initial investment in just 8 days and new orders have been placed. All proceeds go toward funding the market's musicians.
