Adult Summer Library Program: June 1—August 31

- Participants will track books read or listened to, library services used, programs attended, and activities completed to earn prizes.
- For those that want a challenge, there is also Book Genre Bingo.

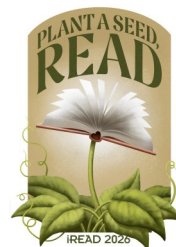

JKPL @ the Dyersville Downtown Market: Saturday, June 27 from 8:00 am—12:00 noon

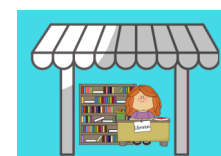
Absolute Science Bubbles Stations
