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James Kennedy Public Library Report to the Mayor and City Council April 17, 2023

Highlights from the Librarian's Report to the Board of Trustees for March 2023 are:

- > 8,124 items were checked out. This is an 10.2% from March 2022. Fiscal year to date, circulation is up 5.3%
- ➤ 22 library cards were issued to new patrons. Fiscal year to date, 248 new library cards have been issued.
- > 85 programs were offered in person, virtually, remotely, and as activity kits. 2,333 people engaged with these activities.
- Four public access computers and three children's computers were available and were used for 166 hours and 404 sessions. Year to date computers were used for 1,362 hours and 3,586 sessions.
- ➤ WiFi Use: 404 sessions, 350 visits, and 85 unique users
- ➤ There were 5,124 library visits.

Library Services:

The JKPL continues to be in Stage 5 of the Pandemic Service Plan. Stage 5 is near normal services with minor restrictions. There are no restrictions on meeting space capacity beyond normal policies, and staff are required to wear masks only if the Community Levels for Dubuque and / or Delaware County (as provided by the CDC) are high. The library will continue to offer programs in different formats to meet the needs of the community.

Upcoming Events:

Enclosed please find a copy of the April events schedule, as well as a preliminary schedule of events planned for May. Some of the programs scheduled include participating in the Dubuque County Reads book discussions, special events celebrating National Library Week, a visit from Iowa Poet Laureate Debra Marquart, a pop-up library at the Happy Healthy You event hosted by Two or Three, partnering with the Dyersville Public Works Department for activities for Public Works Week, and a visit from the Heartland's Future Bus-eum. A Grab and Go Breakfast Burrito fundraiser is scheduled for April 22 and tickets for the National Library Week Trivia event, scheduled for April 28 are available to purchase until April 21. The spring Plant Sale fundraiser is also scheduled for May 20.







April 1—30: Dubuque County Reads!

The James Kennedy Public Library is participating in the first annual *Dubuque County Reads* book discussion! We have partnered with the Dubuque County Library District, Carnegie-Stout Public Library, University of Dubuque Library, Clarke University Library, and Loras College Library to create a new county-wide initiative. The purpose of the *Dubuque County Reads* program is to facilitate events that encourage productive conversation around a common book. This year marks the first of what will become an annual program. Each year will feature a different book, with the selected title aiming to invigorate community members and inspire dialog about important issues and topics. The selected title for 2023 is *Sitting Pretty: The View from My Ordinary Resilient Disabled Body* by Rebekah Taussig, a disability advocate and Instagram star.



Dubuque County Reads book discussions will happen at various locations around the county between April 15—27. Different libraries will be holding discussions on different days and times in the hopes that one of them will work with your schedule so you can attend. Feel free to attend as many as you are able to, wherever you are able! Most discussions will be in-person, but there will be one virtual session run by the James Kennedy Public Library and Carnegie-Stout Public Library.

The book is available to borrow at each participating library, with the appropriate library card required. Digital copies are available to borrow on Hoopla through the Carnegie-Stout Public Library or James Kennedy Public Library, with the respective city resident library card required. Some libraries may even have audiobook copies to borrow. Alternatively, you can purchase a copy of the book from River Lights Bookstore in Dubuque with a 30% discount.


