The Supervisor of Elections of Orange County is hereby requested to coordinate all matters to said referendum election with the Town Clerk. The proposed Charter amendments shall be submitted to the voters at the March 19, 2024 election.

<u>Section 3.</u> The proposed amendments, the ballot title, and the wording of the substance of the proposed amendments to the Charter, as contained in this Ordinance, shall appear on the ballot in the form of questions affixed to this Ordinance as Composite Exhibit 1.

**Section 4.** The Town Clerk is hereby directed to ensure that all advertising, translation, and notice requirements are complied with and to coordinate all activities necessary to conduct the referendum election called for in Section 2 of this Ordinance with the Supervisor of Elections for Orange County.

<u>Section 5.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereto. Further, the lack of approval by a majority of electors of one or more separate amendments to this Charter, as set forth in Section 3 herein, shall not be deemed to affect the validity of any amendments that may be approved by a majority of the electors.

**Section 6.** All ordinances and Charter provisions, or parts of ordinances and Charter provisions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 7.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately and pursuant to the Town's Charter. The revised Charter provisions proposed for approval in this Ordinance shall become effective upon their approval at a referendum election of the electors of the Town of Eatonville in accordance with Section 166.031, Florida Statutes. If the electors reject an amendment, the rejected amendment shall not take effect.
