SECTION X. Chapter 64, *Parks and Recreation*, of the Eatonville Code is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Sec. 28-1. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

<u>At-large</u> means a dog or exotic pet off the owner's premises and not under a competent person's control by means of a leash, cord, or chain.

<u>Competent person</u> means a person of such maturity as to be able to exercise control over an animal.

Control means the regulation of the possession, ownership, care, and custody of animals.

<u>Cruelty</u> means any act of neglect, torture, or torment that causes unjustifiable pain or suffering of an animal.

<u>Dangerous dog means any dog that, according to animal services division records; other animal</u> control or law enforcement authorities; or as attested to by sworn affidavit:

- (1) <u>Has aggressively bitten, attacked or endangered or has inflicted severe injury on a human being on public or private property; or</u>
- (2) Has more than once severely injured or killed a domestic animal while off the owner's property; or
- (3) Has, when unprovoked, chased or approached a person upon the streets, sidewalks or any public grounds in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack; provided that such actions are attested to in a sworn statement by one (1) or more persons and dutifully investigated by the animal services division.

<u>Dangerous dog registration</u> means a division-issued registration form acknowledging that the owner has properly registered a dangerous dog in Orange County.

Director means the director of the department of recreation.

<u>Domestic animals</u> means any dog, cat, ferret, rabbit, or bird that has been domesticated so as to live and breed in a tame condition.

Driver means every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle in or on park property, or who is exercising control of a vehicle or steering a vehicle being towed by a motor vehicle.

ARTICLE VI. - TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATIONS

* * * *

Sec. 28-151. - Domestic animals.

- (a) It is a violation of this article for the owner of domestic dogs or other exotic pets, or the person or persons having charge, care, custody, or control of domestic dogs or exotic pets, to knowingly or unknowingly allow any such animal to be unleashed, unmuzzled and atlarge within the town's limits. It is a violation of this article for the owner of a dog to allow the dog to be left alone and unsupervised, unleashed, unmuzzled and at large outside of an approved enclosure. When being transported, domestic dogs or other exotic pets shall be safely and securely confined within a vehicle.
- (b) No person shall It is a violation of this article for domestic dogs or other exotic pet owner or person having charge, care, custody or control of any dog or exotic pet to bring into, or be responsible for bringing into, or allow to remain in any park or recreation area, any dogs, cats, or other exotic animals, belonging to that person or in his possession their charge, care, custody or control, knowingly or unknowingly, whether leashed or unleashed, other than automobile parking concourses and walks immediately adjacent thereto and in other such areas as may be clearly marked by signs expressly permitting domestic animals in that area. However, nothing herein contained shall be construed as permitting the running of dogs at_large.
