<u>REQUEST</u>: Requesting for discussion that the Historic Town of Eatonville, the oldest Black Township Municipality Incorporated in the United States, acknowledge the elected officials that should bears their names as an awe-inspiring reminder of the purpose of the town's second library in the town's history.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: The Historic Town of Eatonville built the present library located at East Kennedy Blvd, in 2004 with a ceremony held in January 2005. In honor of the elected officials who never receive their honorary plaque or cornerstone on the Library building, an honorary plague is recommended with the names of the elected officials; Mayor Anthony Grant, Council members – Vice Mayor, Marilyn Davis Sconions, James Randolph, Frances Sealey, and Kelvin Frankin.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Recommending for Town Council to approve that the Town of Eatonville acknowledge and recognize the elected officials as mentioned by displaying a plaque on the Library building similar to the Municipal Pool, CRA Building (Old Fire Station), The Law Enforcement Complex (formerly Fire Safety Building), and the Denton Johnson Center Building. Recognition will also include a brief ceremony to be held in honor of Mayor Anthony Grant, Council members – Vice Mayor, Marilyn Davis Sconions, James Randolph, Frances Sealey, and Kelvin Frankin.
