PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES

On Tuesday, February 10, 2026, at 6:30 p.m., the City of Eden, held a public hearing to discuss the 2025 Texas Community Development Block Grant Program (TxCDBG) applications. The purpose of the hearing is to allow citizens an opportunity to discuss a citizen participation plan, development of local housing and community development needs, amount of TxCDBG funding available, all eligible TxCDBG activities, and use of past TxCDBG funds. Some general eligible TxCDBG activities are:

- Water System Improvements
- Wastewater System Improvements
- Drainage Improvements
- Housing Rehabilitation
- Gas System Improvements
- Road/Street Improvements
- Fire Protection Facilities
- Accessibility Improvements to Public Buildings
- Solid Waste Disposal/Landfills/Transfer Stations
- Community/Senior/Social Services Centers
- Shelters for Persons with Special Needs
