My name is Destinie Seide. I am the GDOT Project Manager for PI 0019612. You may already be aware, but we are proposing a roundabout project at SR 17 @ MARLOW ROAD/WESLEY DRIVE.

We are still in the early stages of concept development but want to be sure it is on your radar in case you all receive any questions from area residents or business owners.

Since this project is federally funded on a state route, GDOT does not expect Effingham County to participate in funding the design and construction of the roundabout. The DOT does request that Effingham County fund the operation, repair and maintenance costs of any lighting or lawn care (if applicable) once it has been constructed. Should the project make it beyond the concept phase, GDOT will work with Effingham County to execute an agreement outlining these responsibilities.

In the meantime, I've attached a copy of our "Indication of Roundabout Support Letter", which is just an acknowledgment of your awareness of what's to come in terms of responsibility on the county side.
