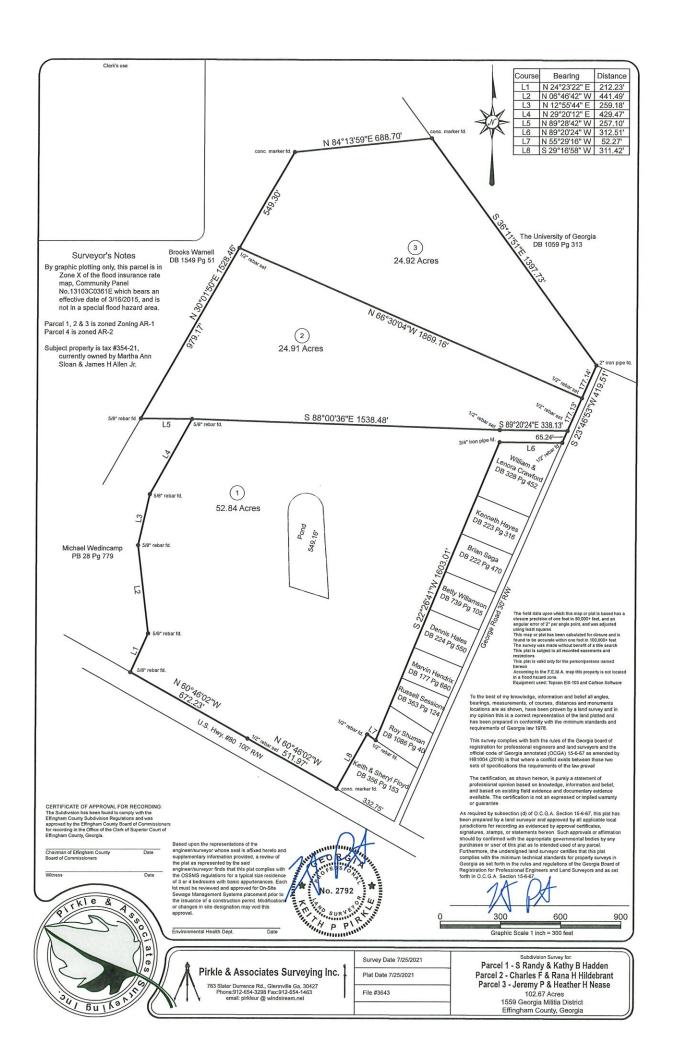

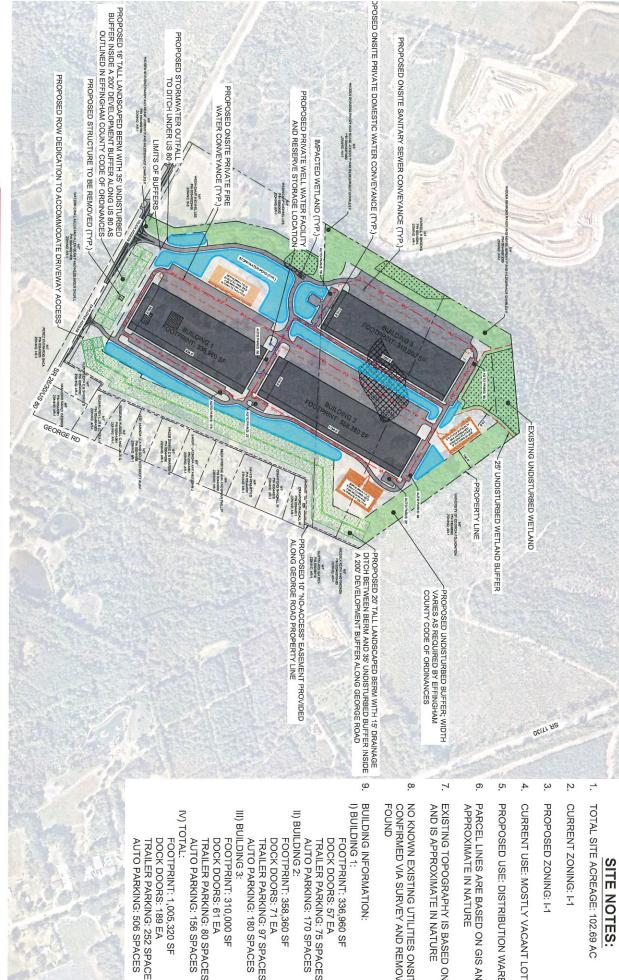

CONCEPTUAL SITE PLAN

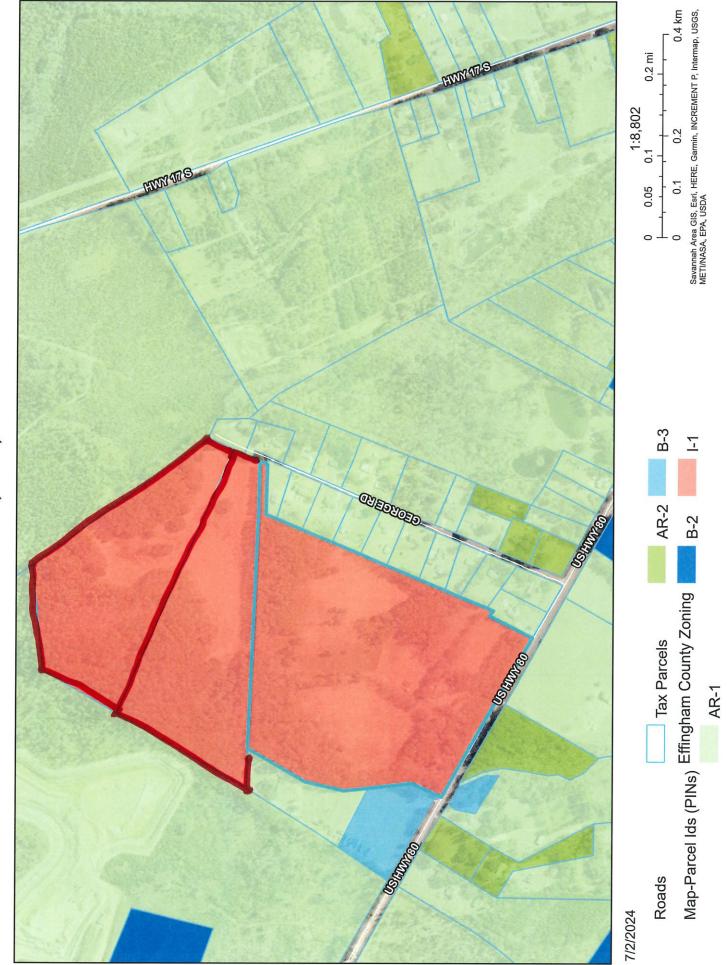
