**CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE THE SECOND READING TO AMEND APPENDIX C, ARTICLE III - SECTION 3.24 (NONCONFORMING BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES) OF THE EFFINGHAM COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES (*1st Reading approved, 05/05/2026*) (4):**

Planning Manager Wright explained that staff has identified the need for greater clarity and refinement in non-conforming provisions to ensure consistent interpretation, improve administration of non-conforming lots and structures, and



align standards with current planning practices and the comprehensive plan. The proposed amendment increases the allowable expansion of nonconforming structures from 25% to 50% of gross floor area. This amendment establishes clear and objective standards, clarifies nonconforming rights, and enhances development flexibility while modernizing practices.

Vice Chair Kieffer made a motion to approve the 2nd Reading. Commissioner Deloach seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**MARGARET SITTON** as agent for **HEATHER SITTON – SECOND READING (5)**: Consideration to approve the Second Reading of an application submitted by Margaret Sitton as agent for Heather Sitton to rezone +/- 0.70 acres located at 2744 US Highway 80 from AR-1 to B-2 to allow for permitted uses in B-2. Map # 355B Parcel # 7 in the First District (*Postponed, 05/05/2026*)

Commissioner Floyd made a motion to approve the 2nd Reading. Commissioner Deloach seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**JAVED MUJADDIDI** as agent for **BRIGHT AUTO WORLD LLC – PUBLIC HEARING (6)**: Planning Board recommends denying an application submitted by Javed Mujaddidi as agent for Bright Auto World LLC to rezone +/- 8.61 acres located at 109 Commerce Court from B-3 to HI to allow for permitted uses in HI Map # 466C Parcel # 4 in the Fifth District (*Postponed, 05/05/2026*)

Planner I Rose explained that the applicant seeks to rezone 8.61 acres from B-3 Major Commercial to HI Heavy Industrial to align an existing vehicle storage and export operation with zoning regulations. The site, operational since 2019, includes a warehouse and outdoor storage area but exceeds its permitted use by handling wrecked vehicles. Code enforcement addressed a complaint about vehicles stored on state property, which were removed. The property, located along Highway 21 Industrial Corridor with wetlands but no FEMA floodplains, faced Planning Board denial due to traffic, operational, and buffer concerns. A conditional use permit and variance are needed to regulate loading, unloading, and storage, requiring fully enclosed outdoor areas with security fencing.

Speaking for: Javed Mujaddidi and Irma Glass maintain that their business is a small company that strictly ships vehicles whole without dismantling them for parts. They also express confidence in their environmental safety, stating that vehicles are drained of excess fuel immediately upon arrival and that they use sawdust to catch any active fluid leaks.

Speaking in objection: Dena Moore expressed concerns with traffic hazards and neighboring parking.

The Board expressed strong hesitancy to approve the request, stating that the business has a history of non-compliance and that granting a heavy industrial shift in a park originally designed for commercial use would set a terrible precedent.



Vice Chair Kieffer made a motion to deny. Commissioner Deloach seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**JAVED MUJADDIDI** as agent for **BRIGHT AUTO WORLD LLC – SECOND READING (7)**: Consideration to approve the Second Reading of an application submitted by Javed Mujaddidi as agent for Bright Auto World LLC to rezone +/- 8.61 acres located at 109 Commerce Court from B-3 to HI to allow for permitted uses in HI. Map # 466C Parcel # 4 in the Fifth District (*Postponed, 05/05/2026*)

This item was denied due to previous action.

**DIETMAR LUTTE** as agent for **RIPPOLINGER LLC – PUBLIC HEARING (8)**: Planning Board recommends denying an application submitted by Dietmar Lutte as agent for Rippolinger LLC to rezone +/- 4.84 acres located at 323 Commerce Drive from B-3 to HI to allow for permitted uses in HI. Map # 466C Parcel # 6 in the Fifth District (*Postponed, 05/05/2026*)

Commissioner Burdette recused himself from this item due to being adjacent to this property.

Planner I Rose explained that the applicant seeks to rezone 4.84 acres from B-3 Major Commercial to HI (Heavy Industrial) for wrecked vehicle import and export operations, including storage, staging, export logistics, warehouse-supported activities, and outdoor storage. The business has operated without a county license since 2018, prompting staff to advise limiting activities to the site and ensuring operational improvements. The surrounding area is primarily industrial, but the requested zoning is a higher intensity than typical commercial use. The planning board recommended denial due to traffic, operational impacts, roadway obstruction complaints, and buffer concerns. Operations must occur on-site with fully enclosed outdoor storage and limited hours from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Speaking for: Dietmar Lutte explained past non-compliance, demonstrating active operational control, and minimizing community and environmental impact.

Speaking in objection: Brent Bowles, the Vice President of Operations and Business Development for Podium Logistics, expressed that drivers often park on the access road to his terminal.

Vice Chair Kieffer made a motion to postpone to 06/02/2026. Commissioner Helmly seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

## **XII – NEW BUSINESS**

### **CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE AN ASSEMBLAGE PERMIT FOR AN EVENT TITLED "COLOR MY OUTDOORS", TO BE HELD AT TOMMY LONG BOAT RAMP SATURDAY, JUNE 20, 2026 FROM 9:00 AM TO 4:00 PM IN PARTNERSHIP WITH SAVANNAH CANOE & KAYAK (1):**

Planner I Rose explained that the applicant seeks approval to host a professional community event at Tommy Long Boat Ramp in Rincon, on June 20, 2026. The event will include guided kayak tours along Ebenezer Creek to the historical massacre site in Springfield, with launches in three-time waves. Participants must wear personal flotation devices at all times on the water. The event will conclude at 6 p.m. and feature one food truck, two permanent restrooms, and a three-stall restroom trailer.

Commissioner Burdette made a motion to approve request for an Assemblage Permit for the “Color My Outdoors” event to be held at Tommy Long Boat Ramp on June 20, 2026, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Commissioner Helmly seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### **CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE JASON SEAMAN AS AGENT FOR SFG CH MASTER DEVCO, LLC REQUESTS APPROVAL OF A PLAT RECOMBINATION AND SUBDIVISION OF COMMERCIAL TRACT GEORGIA INTERNATIONAL TRADE CENTER LOCATED AT THE INTERSECTION OF HWY 21 S AND TRADE CENTER BOULEVARD [Map# 466D Parcel# 21-27] (2):**

Development Services Director Melser explained that this is a plat recombination and subdivision that was initially completed in 2023. It involves realigning the private right-of-way to conform with the previously approved site plan from February. While the number of parcels increases from seven to eight, the total acreage remains unchanged from the prior approval.

Commissioner Helmly made a motion to approve the Plat Recombination and Subdivision of Commercial Tract Georgia International Trade Center. Vice Chair Kieffer seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### **CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE RESOLUTION# 026-013 TO AMEND THE 2026 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET (3):**

Finance Director Barnes explained the amendment primarily adjusts utilities and includes a few other miscellaneous items.

Commissioner Deloach made a motion to approve the resolution to amend the budget for FY 2026. Commissioner Burdette seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.



**CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE AMENDMENT NO. 1 RENEWING THE COUNTY'S PRIMARY DISASTER DEBRIS REMOVAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH CERES ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC. (4):**

Procurement and Contracts Manager Carver explained the amendment includes updated pricing with a 2.4 CPI adjustment to the previously approved unit pricing and extends the contract through July 31, 2027.

Commissioner Deloach made a motion to approve Amendment No. 1 with Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. Vice Chair Kieffer seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 FOR THE CREEKSIDE ELEMENTARY ENTRANCE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT WITH JW OLIVER CONSTRUCTION (5):**

County Engineer Hulme recommended the approval of Change Order No. 1 from J.W. Oliver in the amount of \$111,952.42. These funds will support the additional utility infrastructure and pump station improvements necessary for the Creekside Elementary entrance project and its force main connection. The school district is restricted from using East Boston funds for off-property projects, but alternative funding mechanisms are available. Additionally, the county is responsible for addressing the school's force main capacity requirements.

Commissioner Burdette made a motion to approve Change Order No. 1. Commissioner Floyd seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**CONSIDERATION TO ACKNOWLEDGE AN ANNEXATION PETITION AS SUBMITTED BY THE CITY OF RINCON FOR A PROPERTY OWNED BY BRUCE AND CINDY RAHN CONSISTING OF APPROXIMATELY 114.13 ACRES LOCATED OFF OF LEXINGTON AVE EXT MAP# 447 PARCEL# 13B IN THE FIFTH DISTRICT (6):**

Deputy Clerk Shiggs explained that this parcel of land is located near other properties within the city limits of Rincon and is being considered for annexation to the city. The public has raised concerns regarding this matter.

Jim Head, HOA president of Cates Cove subdivision expressed concerns with the infrastructure, traffic, and financial impacts of a proposed large-scale residential development and annexation.

The Board voiced significant concerns regarding the impact of the proposed development on surrounding unincorporated residents and county infrastructure.

Vice Chair Kieffer made a motion to postpone this item to the 06/02/2026 meeting. Commissioner Helmly seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**XVI – PLANNING BOARD – 6:00 pm**

**CHAD BRENNAN – PUBLIC HEARING (01):** Consideration to approve an application by Chad Brennan for a variance from Section 3.21.1, located at 209 Green Bridge Lane, to allow for the occupation of a tiny home during the construction of a home in AR-2. Map # 352G Parcel # 9 in the First District.

Senior Planner Barlett explained the applicant plans to reside in a tiny home temporarily during the construction of a new primary residence and will remove it upon completion. Staff consider limited temporary use of the tiny home a reasonable solution, allowing occupancy for up to 12 months during construction, with a requirement to vacate upon project completion.

Speaking for: Chad Brennan stated that they are building a permanent home for their family of four.

Map # 466C Parcel # 6 in the Fifth District

This item was postponed to the 06/02/2026 meeting due to previous action.

**WANDA RAY - PUBLIC HEARING (07):** Consideration to approve an application by Wanda Ray for a conditional use to allow for a Residential Business in AR-1 located at 2672 Blue Jay Road. Map # 373A Parcel # 6 in the Fourth District

Senior Planner Barlett explained that the applicant seeks approval to operate a residential business for clearing, grading, and land preparation with one dump truck, one trash truck, one low-boy trailer, and no additional employees. The property is zoned AR-1, permitting low-intensity non-residential activities through a conditional use process, with the proposed use unlikely to impact surrounding properties. The business owner is limited to storing two commercial trucks, two commercial trailers, and up to two pieces of heavy equipment in the rear yard.



Speaking for: James and Wanda Ray explained they have owned and operated WJJ Enterprise on 18 acres since 2015, with the business license covering five acres and their house on the same five acres.

Commissioner Helmly made a motion to approve the application with the following conditions:

1. An Effingham County Occupational Tax Certificate (business license) shall be obtained and kept in good standing.
2. All applicable zoning and development standards must be met, including but not limited to setbacks, access requirements, and any departmental review standards.
3. The Conditional Use approval applies only to the \*\*owner-operated residential business as described in the application. Any expansion of the business, addition of employees, or significant increase in customer traffic may require additional review and approval by Effingham County.
4. Outdoor storage associated with the business shall be limited to two commercial trucks, two commercial trailers, and no more than two pieces of heavy equipment. All business-related vehicles, trailers, and equipment shall be stored in the rear yard only and screened from adjacent properties and public rights-of-way where practicable.

Commissioner Deloach seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**WANDA RAY – SECOND READING (08):** Consideration to approve the Second Reading for an application by Wanda Ray for a conditional use to allow for a Residential Business in AR-1 located at 2672 Blue Jay Road Map # 373A Parcel # 6 in the Fourth District

Commissioner Helmly made a motion to approve the 2nd Reading. Commissioner Deloach seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**RANDAL THOMPSON – PUBLIC HEARING (09):** Consideration to approve an application by Randal Thompson for a conditional use to allow for a Residential Business in AR-2 located at 2265 GA Hwy 119 South Map # 320 Parcel # 50D in the Third District

Senior Planner Barlett explained that the applicant seeks approval to operate a residential hardscaping business specializing in patios and pavers, with equipment stored in the rear yard and transported to active job sites. The property is zoned AR-2, permitting low-intensity non-residential uses through a conditional use process. The proposed use is not anticipated to negatively impact surrounding properties or significantly alter regulations. Outdoor storage of business vehicles, trailers, and equipment is limited to the rear yard.

Speaking for: Randal Thompson notes that, according to the provided photo, they have recently cleaned up a substantial portion of the backyard in compliance with a recent directive from code enforcement.



Speaking in objection: Mark Jacobs and Dan Webster expressed concerns with construction debris, deficient visual screening, inability to sell and hostile behavior.

The Board engaged in a discussion regarding the business operation within a residential subdivision.

Commissioner Deloach made a motion to deny the request. Commissioner Burdette seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**RANDAL THOMPSON – SECOND READING (10):** Consideration to approve the Second Reading for an application by Randal Thompson for a conditional use to allow for a Residential Business in AR-2 located at 2265 GA Hwy 119 South Map # 320 Parcel # 50D in the Third District

This item was denied due to previous action.
