Summary Recommendation:

Staff request ECBOC's approval to apply for the Coastal Incentive Grant (Cycle 28) for \$80,000 to support the Atlas Park Project. This grant requires a 1:1 non-federal funds match, which the county will provide.

Executive Summary:

The Atlas Park Project is a critical initiative for Effingham County, aiming to enhance public access to coastal resources, improve environmental stewardship, and promote recreational opportunities in the region. Through the Coastal Incentive Grant (CIG) Cycle 28, offered by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources Coastal Resources Division, Effingham County seeks \$80,000 to fund improvements to Atlas Park, with a matching contribution from the county as required.

The project will focus on coastal habitat restoration, enhanced water quality, and community education on sustainable practices. The CIG aligns with Effingham County's environmental sustainability, conservation, and resilience goals while enriching recreational options for residents and visitors.
