County Manager Callanan began the work session presentation detailing the governance framework, zoning history, environmental protections, and economic impacts associated with Project Camellia (OpenAI data center).

The meeting proceeded to the public Q&A portion, with County Clerk Johnson managing the timer. The Board extended the time beyond the scheduled 30-minute allotment to accommodate public input after the presentation finished early. Speakers were granted three minutes each, proceeding in sequence from the sign-up list.

Property Values & Regional Moratoriums, Public Transparency & NDAs, Industrial Realities & Economic Trade-Offs, Tax Terms & Decommissioning Bonds, Property Line Impacts & Noise Studies, Table of Permitted Uses (TPU) & Steering Committee, Backup Power & Emissions, IDA Land Sale & Local Revenue, Wastewater & Chemical Contamination, Fire, Explosion, and Safety Hazards, Electromagnetic Field (EMF) Health Risks, Call for Heightened Restrictions, Request for Visual Plans, Local Vendor Opportunities, Power, Water, and Resource Allocation, Environmental & Neighborhood Impacts, IDA Independence & Board Oversight, Privacy & Surveillance Systems, Environmental & Aquifer Safeguards, Preservation of Historic Cemetery, Claw back Penalties & Contractual Enforcement, Backup Power & Redacted Contracts, Homeowner Relief Funds, Public Document Accessibility, Project Scale & Disruption, IDA Accountability & Tax Levies, Water Allocation & Infrastructure Costs.

Andy Hudson expressed appreciation to the board, staff and attendees for sharing information and encouraged being intentional on about how the data center comes to fruition.

Leadership committed to hiring technical specialists and announced plans to host a public panel featuring OpenAI representatives to directly address fire suppression, safety protocols, and operational details.
