Summary Recommendation:

Staff requests the Board to ratify and approve the submission of the SS4A grant application.

Executive Summary:

Effingham County has submitted a grant application to the U.S. Department of Transportation's Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Planning and Demonstration Grant for the Effingham County LITE Project. This project aims to enhance roadway safety by installing 100 solar-powered LED light poles along high-risk roadways. The goal is to reduce nighttime crashes, particularly in underserved areas, and improve safety for all road users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists. The project aligns with SS4A's goal of reducing roadway fatalities and serious injuries.

The grant seeks \$1,408,000 in federal funding with a required 20% local match, totaling \$352,000 from Effingham County, making the total project cost \$1,760,000.

Background:

Effingham County prioritizes roadway safety improvements in response to increasing traffic volumes and incidents. The SS4A Planning and Demonstration Grant is designed to fund safety action plans and demonstration projects that address critical safety issues. The LITE Project, part of the county's larger safety action plan, will focus on solar-powered lighting solutions for enhanced visibility and reduced energy costs, with long-term goals of improving safety and sustainability on county roads.

- 1. Approve the ratification of the SS4A grant application submission.
- 2. Do not approve the ratification.
