(a) The sole and exclusive administration of and responsibility for the proper operation of the system and for making effective the provisions of this ordinance is hereby vested in a board of trustees defined elsewhere herein as the board. The board is hereby designated as the plan administrator, provided that it may delegate plan administration duties to a third-party plan administrator in its discretion. (b) The membership of the board shall consist of five members serving in numbered seats. Seats 1 and 2 must be legal residents of the city and must be appointed by the Eustis City Commission for two (2) year terms. Seat 1 shall be appointed in November of each year ending in an odd number and Seat 2 shall be appointed in November of each year ending in an even number. Seats 3 and 4 must be held by full-time police officers defined in F.S. § 185.02(16) who are elected by a majority of the active police officers who are members of such plan for two (2) year terms. Seat 3 shall be elected in November of each year ending in an odd number and Seat 4 shall be elected in November of each year ending in an even number. Seat 5 shall be chosen by a majority of the previous four members as provided herein, and such person's name shall be submitted to the Eustis City Commission. Upon receipt of the fifth person's name, the Eustis City Commission shall, as a ministerial duty, appoint such person to the board. The member holding Seat 5 shall have the same rights as each of the other four members and shall serve as trustee for a period of two (2) years Each member may succeed himself or herself as a trustee so long as the member otherwise meets the requirements of that seat. In the event that any seat becomes vacant, a successor member who meets the requirements of that seat shall be appointed or elected in the manner required for that seat and shall serve for the remaining term of that seat. The board shall establish and administer the nominating and election procedures for each election. The board shall meet at least quarterly each year. The board shall be a legal entity with, in addition to other powers and responsibilities contained herein, the power to bring and defend lawsuits of every kind, nature, and description. (c) The trustees shall, by a majority vote, elect a chairman and a secretary. If the board has not appointed an administrator, the secretary of the board shall keep a complete minute book of the actions, proceedings, or hearings of the board. The trustees shall not receive any compensation as such, but may receive expenses and per diem as provided by law. (d) Each trustee shall be entitled to one vote on the board. Three affirmative votes shall be necessary for any decision by the trustees at any meeting of the board.
