A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FAIR OAKS RANCH, TEXAS AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF PROJECT APPLICATION(S) TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR FY 2026-27 HIGHWAY SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (HSIP) FUNDING, AND EXECUTION OF ALL DOCUMENTS RELATIVE TO THE SUBMISSION BY THE CITY MANAGER

WHEREAS, the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) aims to eliminate or reduce the number and severity of traffic crashes on public roads; and,

WHEREAS, the HSIP includes funds for construction and operational improvements of qualifying projects that are located off the state highway system; and,

WHEREAS, the HSIP covers 90% of the construction cost of approved projects up to the maximum federal funding obligated amount; and,

WHEREAS, local government agencies are responsible for 10% of the construction cost of approved projects plus engineering, environmental, ROW acquisition, direct state costs and any overruns; and,

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) San Antonio District is currently accepting project applications from local government agencies for the FY 2026-27 HSIP cycle; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it in the best interest of the residents of the City of Fair Oaks Ranch to apply for HSIP funding for eligible and competitive projects;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIR OAKS RANCH, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby selects the following project(s) for submission to TxDOT for the FY2026-27 HSIP funding cycle:

- 1) Ammann Road Curve Safety Improvements
(\$2,017,043 estimated construction cost)
- 2) Other (add or strike as appropriate)

Section 2. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager or his designee to submit applications to TxDOT for the above-mentioned projects, and execute any required documents relative to the submission.

Section 3. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provision of this resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

Section 5. This resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

If any provision of this resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 6. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this resolution is adopted was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this resolution, was given, all as required Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 7. This resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.
