Marketing Focus- Community Day (UKC)

CFK's Inaugural Community Day at the Upper Keys Center was on Saturday, January 25, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Similar to the long-running event at the Key West Campus, the familyfriendly event attracted community members of all ages to visit the Upper Keys Center, meet CFK employees and students, and learn more about CFK programs, initiatives, and partners.









Inquiries


Prospective students from all over the country with various interests continue to inquire about CFK. A total of 74 inquiries have been received since the last board report.

Alumni & Donor Relations

Scholarships

The Coordinator of Alumni & Donor Relations has awarded all spring 2025 scholarships with the exception of the Ocean Reef Community Foundation (ORCF) Building Bridges Scholarship, which is still open to students.

In addition, for the ORCF Building Bridges Scholarships, approximately \$29,937.70 has been offered, but not yet awarded (or included in the chart above), for tuition and fees to 36 UKC students as of December 2024. Students may still apply for this "last dollar" scholarship through February 2, 2025. Funds for tuition, fees, and eligible required tools or uniforms will be disbursed in March.

Summer and fall 2025 scholarships are being promoted, with additional opportunities expected to be added.

Thanks to two generous donations, the College is launching a new scholarship for high school students in the middle and upper Keys who are pursuing career technical education and workforce training. The Nextgen Opportunity for Workforce (NOW) Scholarship is a full-cost scholarship that covers tuition, fees, and other educational expenses, allowing recipients to focus entirely on completing their programs. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is not required to apply, making this opportunity accessible to all students. The College is collaborating with Monroe County School District to recruit students at Marathon High School and Coral Shores High School to apply for the scholarship. Applications for fall 2025 are due February 28.

Alumni

The Alumni Committee has been established to implement the Alumni Strategic Plan. The group is comprised of a cross-section of employees and is led by Lana Gaspari, Vice President of Advancement, and Amber Ernst-Leonard, Associate Vice President of College and Community Engagement.

CFK alumni have been encouraged to apply or nominate classmates for the 2025 Alumni of the Year award, which will be presented at the Spring Commencement Ceremony. Through this annual recognition, the College honors an exceptional alumnus or alumna who embodies Tuga Spirit and has demonstrated professional distinction, service to society, and/or support of the College and/or community. Applications and nominations will be accepted through January 31.

Financial Aid and Veteran Services

The Financial Aid department continues to receive FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) submissions from students enrolled in the spring 2025 semester. As of January 14, 2025, the College received 1,397 FAFSA applications for the 2024-25 academic year, which opened on December 31, 2023. In comparison, last year on the same date, CFK received 1,377, reflecting an increase of approximately three percent.

The department is conducting regulatory requirements with administering and authorizing financial aid. These processes include, but are not limited to:

- verification of course enrollment.
- verification of student eligibility status (i.e., proof of citizenship, confirming accurate tax information, ensuring students meet satisfactory academic progress, etc.).
- conducting audits of their enrolled courses to ensure they are aligned with their degree programs.
- verifying their participation in their courses during the first week of their term.

The Financial Aid department has 11 students who will return to the federal work-study program. The work-study program has been shared with students through Canvas and email notifications.

The College was awarded \$488,482 for the Open Door Grant for the academic year 2024-25, with the funds divided between two terms. For the fall term, the Financial Aid department awarded \$244,241. Due to a higher number of eligible students, the College was awarded an additional \$256,000 in supplemental funding from Office of Student Financial Assistance. As a result, the Financial Aid department successfully awarded approximately 300 students in the fall term.

Ms. Kim Pickren started as Coordinator of Financial Aid on January 2, 2025. Originally from the coastal town of Brunswick, Georgia, Kim relocated to Key West in the summer of 2024. Before joining The College of the Florida Keys, she worked in medical claims and billing with Wellstar Health System.





Enrollment Management

The College recognizes the importance of providing students with information to facilitate the transfer of credit, testing, and maintaining academic quality and integrity for awarding credit for testing, military service, prior learning, and coursework completed at another institution. The Enrollment Management department evaluates high school and college transcripts.

The tables below show transcript evaluations completed for the calendar years 2024 and 2025. For the calendar year 2024, the department evaluated 574 high school transcripts and 543 college transcripts.

For the calendar year 2025, as of January 15, 2025, the department evaluated 23 high school transcripts and 27 college transcripts. In the 2024 calendar year, Enrollment Management evaluated 48 high school transcripts compared to the 23 evaluated in the same period in 2025. Further, 44 college transcripts were evaluated in 2024 compared to the 27 college transcripts evaluated for the same period in 2025.





FTE

As of January 15, 2025, the spring 2025 FTE is 397.0 compared to the three-year average of 355.2. The budgeted goal for the spring 2025 FTE is 388.0.

Athletics

The CFK swim team competed in two meets to complete the first part of the season for swimming. At the first meet, the Gulliver Gobble-Gobble on November 23 and 24, 2024, in Miami, FL, Mr. Lebsack broke three school records in the 50yd fly, the 100yd fly, and the 200yd fly. At the Tuga Time trials at the CFK pool, the team of Mr. Fagley, Mr. Montiel de la Nuez, Mr. Kertis, and Mr. Lebsack broke two relay records in the 200yd free relay and the 200yd medley relay. Mr. Fagley also broke the 50yd backstroke record. A total of six swimmers - two females and four males qualified for NJCAA National Championships in 24 individual events and four relay events.

Aquatics

For the months of November and December, instructors at the pool taught 163 children and adult swim lessons in either private or group lessons. The age group swim team, Bone Island Swim Club, has 66 members. Athletic Director, Lori Bosco taught water safety to seven EMT students.
