Zach Bosch, Civil Engineer with the Public Works Department Traffic Division, gave a presentation and responded to questions from the City Council. Vice Mayor Raithel suggested implementing a six-month pilot program ahead of the upcoming budget cycle. City Manager Whitemyer recommended targeting a February timeframe to align with the budget planning process. Mayor Aquino requested that one of the pilot locations be situated near the DMV.

CITY MANAGER REPORTS

City Manager Bryan Whitemyer congratulated Public Works Director Mark Rackovan on his long-standing service to the City of Folsom and noted appreciation for his accomplishments. He announced the recruitment for the next Public Works Director is underway, closing June 22, with the Water and Environmental Resources Director Marcus Yasutake serving as interim Director during the transition.

He reminded the City Council of the upcoming budget workshop on May 27 at 2:00 p.m. at the Folsom Public Library, budget discussions will continue at the June 10 and June 24 City Council meetings, noting the option for additional workshops if needed. The City Manager shared his experience attending the Cap-to-Cap program, highlighting valuable meetings with regional partners and discussions on local infrastructure issues, including the Empire Ranch Interchange. He mentioned facility updates, including temporary closure of the Senior and Arts Center (May 19–June 20) for HVAC replacement and limited senior programs will continue (June 2- 20) at the Folsom Community Center, Folsom Library closure on May 20 for lighting system upgrades (reopening May 21) and upcoming events including free Skate and BMX Jam May 17 at Cummings Family Park, Community Service Day planning meeting on May 14, “Battle of the Badges” blood drive on June 4, and the next CERT training academy. He also reported the Folsom Police Department’s Motor Team participation in National Police Week in Washington, D.C., honoring fallen officers, attendance at the Folsom Police Awards Ceremony recognizing exemplary service, and Folsom Fire's traditional push-in ceremony for Ladder Truck 35 on April 26.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Vice Mayor Raithel shared his appreciation for a recent ride-along with Folsom Fire Department Station 35, expressing gratitude for the hospitality and insight into daily operations. He acknowledged ongoing challenges in the Park Shore and Farmhouse communities related to homelessness, especially near Fish and Wildlife property. He thanked the City Manager, HOT team, Folsom Police, Parks and Recreation, and other staff for their responsive efforts in providing relief and solutions. Raithel also commended Parks and Recreation and Community Development staff for facilitating recent commission meetings with strong public engagement. He encouraged continued community participation and thanked staff for their professionalism in addressing resident concerns. He concluded by reflecting on the privilege of serving in Folsom, emphasizing the city's unique and special character.

Councilmember Rohrbough reflected on the value of attending the Cap-to-Cap program alongside City Manager Bryan Whitemyer, emphasizing the unique opportunity to connect with elected officials and regional leaders to strengthen future partnerships for Folsom. She highlighted productive discussions focused on infrastructure, including meetings with the Federal Transit Administration and a White House special assistant, centering on transportation solutions. She and the City Manager also met with Congressman Kevin Kiley to advocate for the Empire Ranch Interchange project. Rohrbough thanked Public Works Department Engineering Manager Ryan Chance and city staff for their preparation and support, noting that the information provided was instrumental in representing the city's needs. She underscored the importance of continuing progress on the interchange project to alleviate traffic on East Bidwell and affirmed Council's shared commitment to this goal.

Councilmember Leary thanked Environmental and Water Resources Director Marcus Yasutake for stepping in during the City Manager's absence and assisting with local construction-related issues involving PG&E and AT&T. She stressed the importance of contractors providing residents with proper advance notice before work begins. She recognized participants in the recent Public Safety Citizens Academy and noted that several graduates plan to volunteer with police and fire services. She highlighted upcoming educational sessions on the Lighting and Landscape District ballot measure for Natoma Station, encouraging community participation to help shape future service strategies. She also reported on a recent trip to Washington, D.C., where she and city representatives met with federal officials to discuss regional water infrastructure needs, including conjunctive use and underground water storage projects. The meetings emphasized collaboration with surrounding communities to improve long-term water supply and resilience.

Mayor Aquino reported on her participation in the Cap-to-Cap trip, where she served as Honorary Vice Chair of the Air Quality Team along with District Attorney Thien Ho. She met with Congressmen Kevin Kiley and Tom McClintock, U.S. Representative Ami Bera, and U.S. Senators Alex Padilla and Adam Schiff to discuss infrastructure, air quality, tariffs, and public safety. She also toured Northern Virginia as part of a SACOG-sponsored visit and shared innovative community planning ideas observed there, including housing above a fire station and a community center adjacent to affordable housing. Mayor Aquino thanked Commander Lockhart and Lieutenant VerHalen for attending a Sacramento County Board of Supervisors meeting with her to address delays in the jail booking process. She noted Folsom officers are spending up to five hours booking a single suspect, largely due to health screenings. These delays reduce patrol coverage and increase overtime costs. The issue was raised alongside leaders from Elk Grove Police and the Sacramento Police Department. Finally, Mayor Aquino requested a follow-up report on the city ordinance prohibiting alley parking, asking whether it has improved access for emergency and waste services, particularly in the Historic District.

There being no further business to come before the City Council, the meeting was adjourned at 9:05 pm.
