### **CITY MANAGER REPORTS**

City Manager Bryan Whitemyer announced upcoming events including a September 11 remembrance at Lions Park, the temporary closure and planned rebuild of Castle Park, and the ongoing budget review process with community meetings on September 23 and October 14. The City will also celebrate the 25th anniversary of its Sister City relationship with Pieve del Grappa, Italy, with cultural events this Saturday, and the Friends of the Folsom Library Book Sale will be held September 12–14. He also provided an update on the River Ridge Way incident and thanked all responding agencies.

### **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Councilmember Kozlowski noted that Friends of Folsom Parkway are leading a major fire safety project to remove lighter fuel in the Creek Nature Preserve. The effort will begin before Community Service Day, continue beyond it, and take place every Thursday for the foreseeable future. Volunteers are encouraged to participate

Vice Mayor Raithel reported on recent discussions regarding e-scooters and e-motorcycles, noting positive collaboration between the City and the School District to strengthen enforcement and address

community concerns. Additionally, concerns were raised about the Johnny Cash Art Trail guitar pick installation, with feedback that the design does not match public expectations. Given the mixed reception of the first installation, he suggested reconsidering plans for the second pick and potentially bringing the matter back for further discussion.

Councilmember Leary supported revisiting the Johnny Cash Art Trail guitar pick discussion, suggesting alternative options and potential input from the artist. A request was made for a future council presentation from Library Director Tom Gunnerson to review library operations, funding, and usage, highlighting the library's high countywide utilization. She also asked about requesting future agenda item requests. Lastly, updates were shared on meetings regarding economic development opportunities, with an emphasis on filling vacant commercial spaces through regional outreach and business recruitment.

Councilmember Rohrbough expressed support for revisiting the Johnny Cash Art Trail guitar pick discussion and for a future presentation from the Library Director highlighting library usage and operations. Additional suggestions included placing e-bike and e-scooter regulations on a future agenda to provide public education, review enforcement efforts, and consider possible ordinance changes.

Mayor Aquino invited everyone to join a video call with the Pieve del Grappa Mayor and other elected leaders during the expanded Farmers Market event this Saturday at 11:00 a.m. at the amphitheater stage.
