He reported on Fire and Police Department activities and warned residents about phone scams.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Leary recognized Jake's Journey Home for successful fundraising work and commended Jeanne Shuman. She expressed appreciation for the postponement of the proposed fireworks at the October rodeo event, thanking Mayor Aquino for her role in addressing concerns.

Councilmember Rohrbough highlighted the strong community turnout at the Castle Park celebration and thanked Joanne Brausch and the Parks & Recreation Department for their efforts toward community engagement.

Councilmember Kozlowski congratulated both high school football teams on their season-opening wins and noted upcoming cross-country meets. He shared highlights from attending a Sacramento State basketball fundraiser.

Vice Mayor Raithel noted strong community support for the Castle Park fundraiser. He provided an update on the Sacramento Transportation Authority (STA) meeting, highlighting safety concerns with the I-Street Bridge and the STA's potential funding role in accelerating its replacement.

Mayor Aquino acknowledged the recent Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District ceremony at City Hall and commended city staff for their outstanding support. She congratulated Rebecca Neves on her appointment as Public Works Director and thanked Environmental and Water Resources Director Marcus Yasutake for managing multiple roles recently as the interim Public Works Director and the Interim City Manager. Lastly, she extended birthday wishes to Vice Mayor Raithel.
