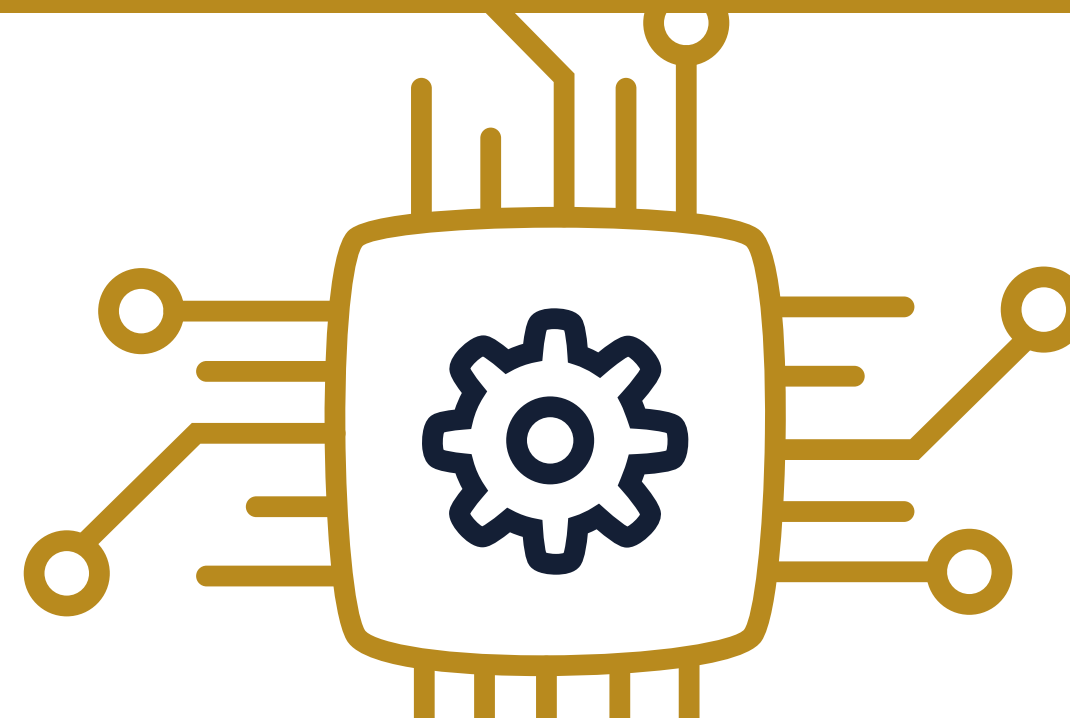

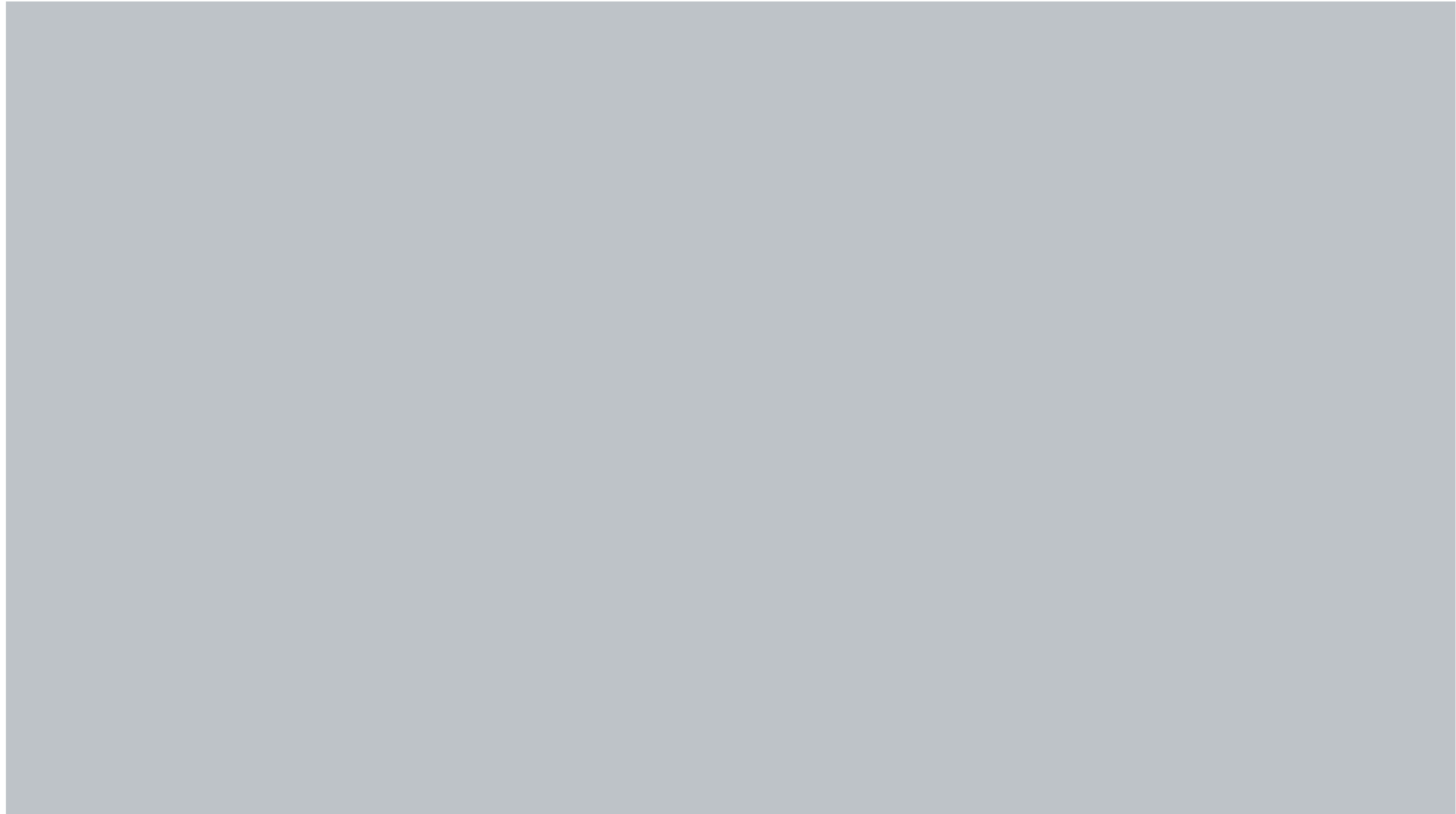

What is Community Risk Reduction?



According to NFPA 1300, Community Risk Reduction (CRR) is a process to identify and prioritize local risks, followed by the integrated and strategic investment of resources to reduce their occurrence and impact. A progressive CRR strategy will help communities protect their residents, business owners, and visitors in a changing world. As more communities implement CRR, first responders will be safer, resources will be allocated appropriately, and individual responsibility for prevention will become normalized across the community.

- The first critical step of a CRR Plan
- An accurate CRA relies on data
- Rich data provides the foundation for a comprehensive CRA Strategy
- CRAIG 1300 is a CRA Tool
- Using this tool helps tell our community's risk story through visualizations

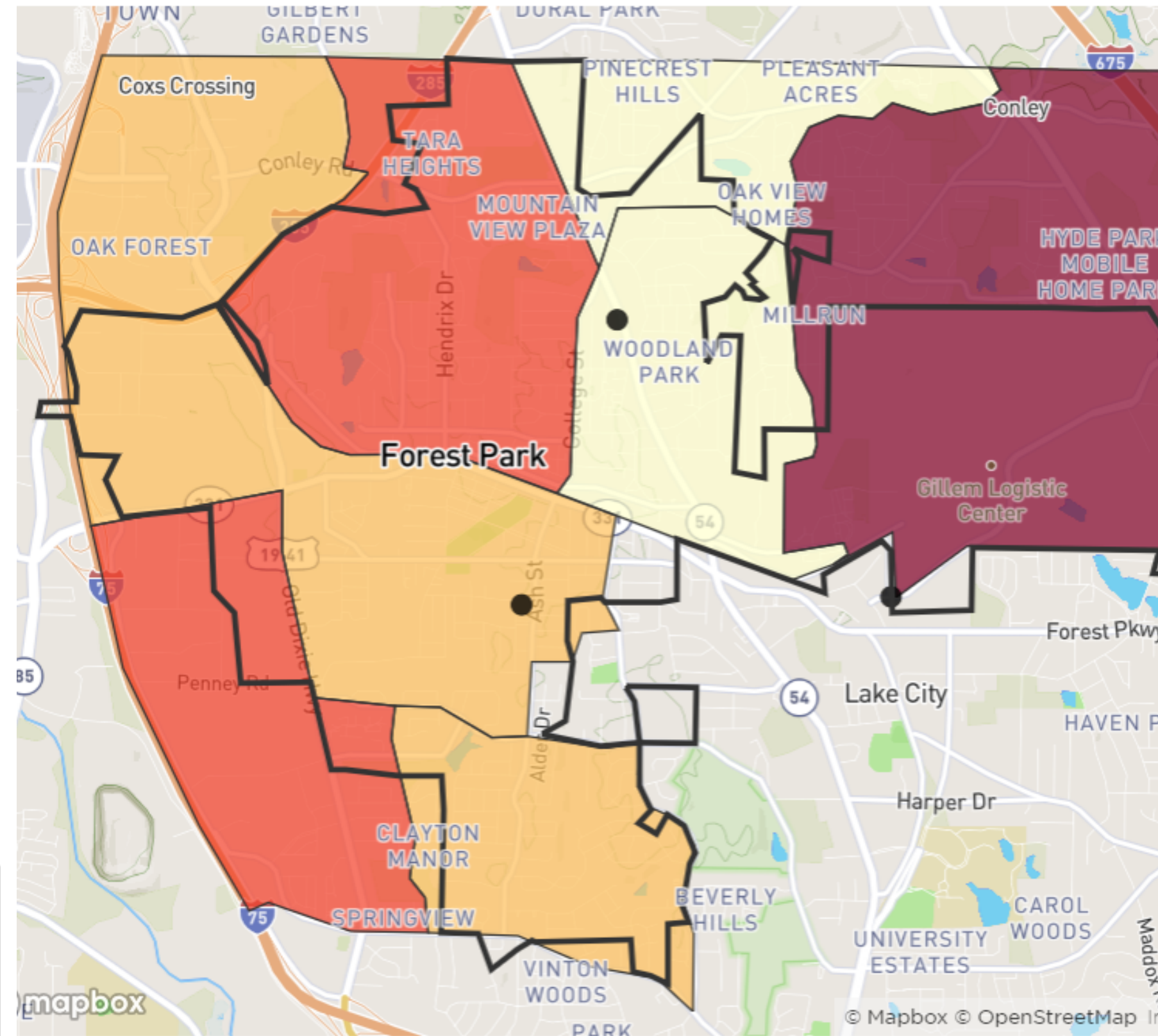

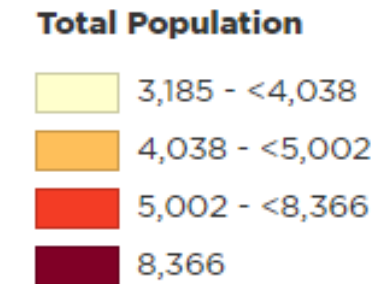

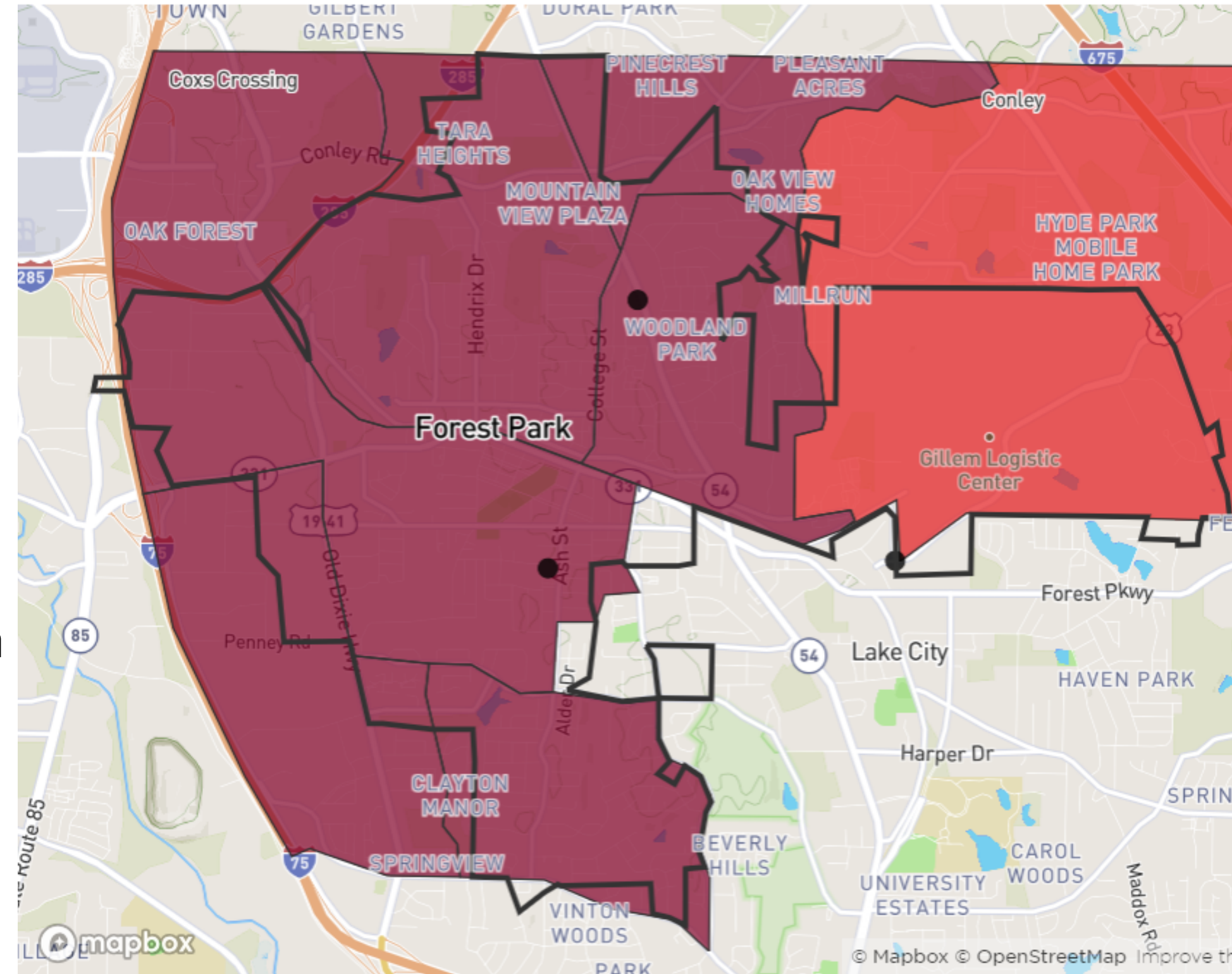

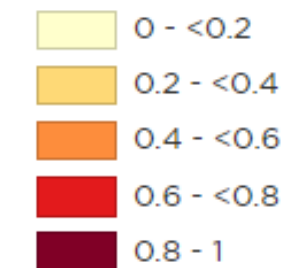

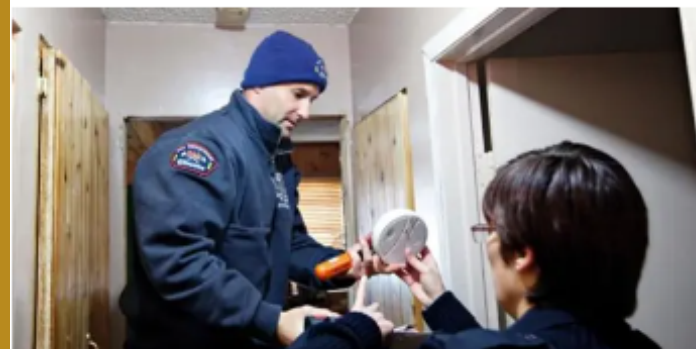

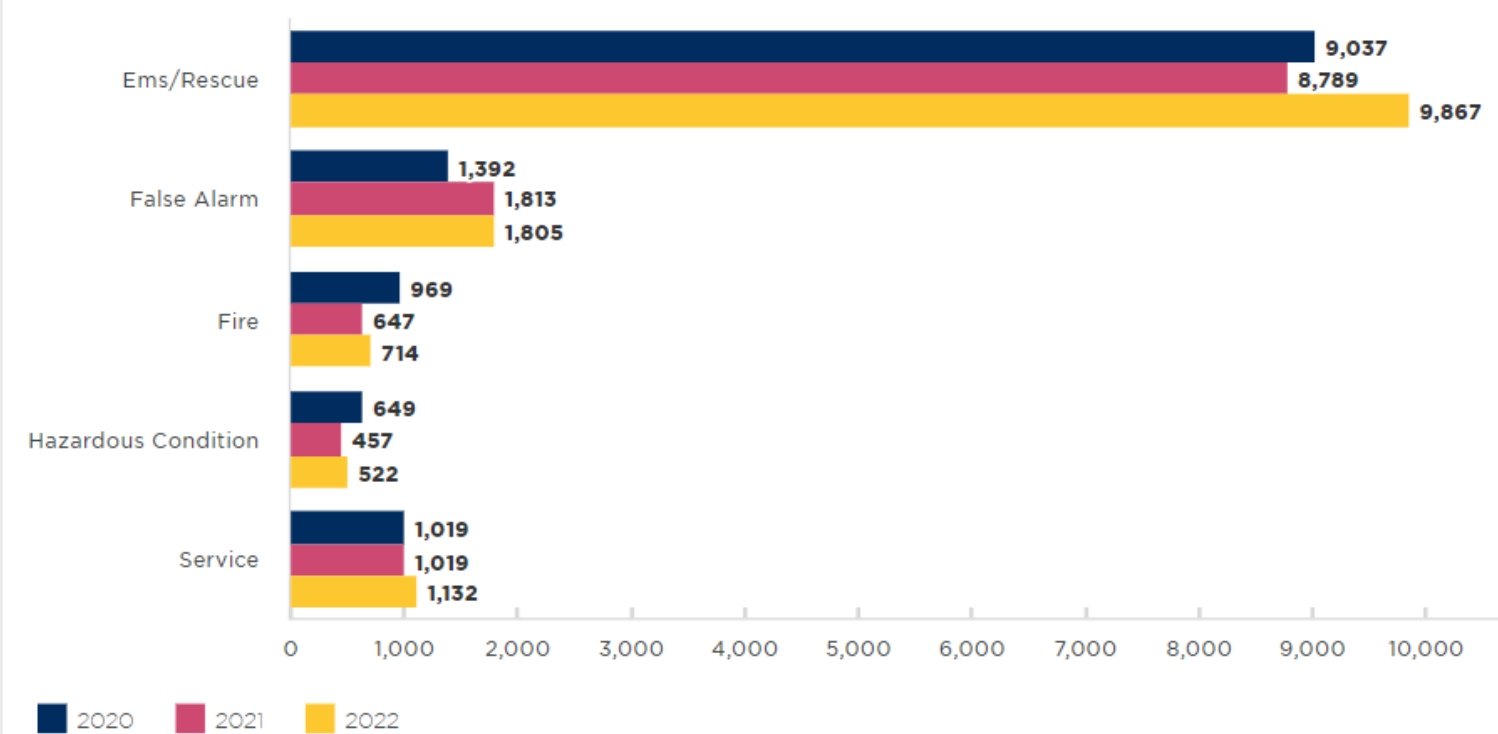
Key Statistics

Prevention and response tactics are driven by a variety of factors. Awareness of event history including top incident types, actions taken, and property types should guide planning efforts.

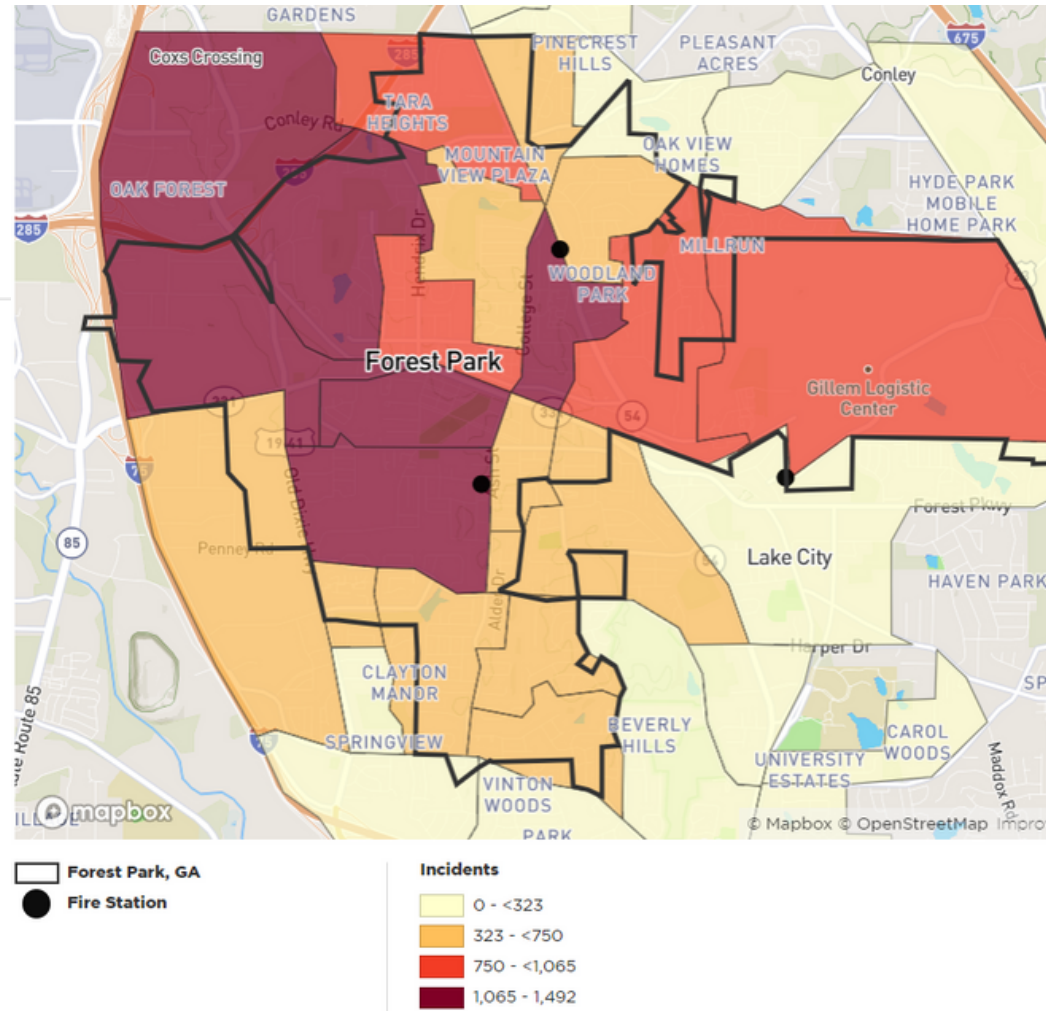

Location of Incidents

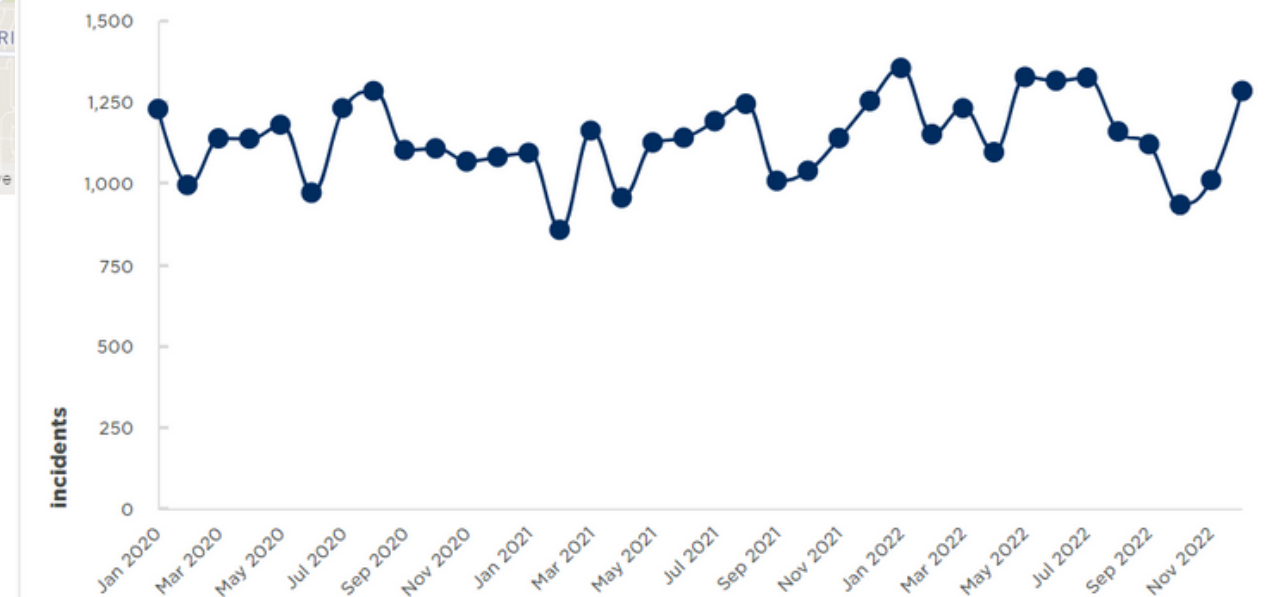


Trends & Timelines
