Application Now Open For City's Home Repair Program

Qualifying Legacy Residents Can Receive Up To \$10,000 Through Grant Funding

FOREST PARK, Ga. — Dec. 29, 2023 — Today, the City of Forest Park proudly announced the launch of its Homeowner Maintenance Enhancements (H.O.M.E.) Program, which aims to assist legacy residents ages 62 and older with essential home repairs or modifications — all while working to ensure their respective living spaces are safe and conducive to a comfortable lifestyle.

The initiative, which was approved unanimously by Mayor Angelyne Butler, MPA, and City Council, allocates \$1.3 million in grant funding from the American Rescue Plan Act to help cover the cost of eligible repair work ranging from roofing, painting and minor electrical work to ADA improvements, siding and more. Grant funds awarded to qualifying residents will not have to be repaid.




"By taking the proactive step of actively addressing the city's aging housing stock, we are able to improve the overall look and feel of neighborhoods in Forest Park one home at a time," said Mayor Angelyne Butler, MPA. "Forest Park is a city for every season and a place where memories are created. Not only does this dynamic program add to the incredible progress we continue to make as a municipality, but it is also our way of supporting those who have given so much to our beloved community."

The application process for the city's H.O.M.E. Program has been broken down into three basic steps, which include:

 Step #1 (Application Submission): The application is available for individuals ages 62 and older who reside in the City of Forest Park and meet federal income requirements. Residents can apply directly online. Once received, city officials will review each application for processing.

City's Finance Department Enhancing Procurement Services With OpenGov Cloud-Based Software Helps Streamline Customer Service, Increases Transparency




FOREST PARK, Ga. - July 1, 2024 - In an effort to strategically modernize its internal procurement service capabilities, the City of Forest Park has officially transitioned to a new digital eProcurement platform, OpenGov, enabling Clayton County's largest municipality to shift away from paper-based bid solicitations to a fully automated, electronic bidding and vendor management system.

Founded in 2012, OpenGov is a leading government software provider that specializes in cloud-based solutions for various municipal services, including procurement, contract management, accounting and more. As part of the city's ONE Forest Park initiative, the transition to the OpenGov software is expected to significantly improve operational efficiency within the city's Finance Department, while also facilitating a smoother, more transparent bidding process for both vendors and city staff.






