I recommend that the City make a resolution that any data center to be built in Forest Gove must not create unpleasant noise, must meet the U.S. Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) standards, and must feature a green roof, green hedges or green exterior walls, native plant landscaping, and a public multi-use path around the perimeter. The last thing we need is to use a colossal amount of land and water and energy for a project that makes an ugly noise and will provide zero housing and few jobs. We cannot afford to eliminate more green space with an irresponsible industrial project. I am not saying the current proposal is irresponsible; I appreciate that the current data center proposal embraces some green building values, but please hold them to a very high standard. Do not accept a proposal just because they have a few solar panels or a few bike racks, or just because they will hire a bunch of builders for a short time. It is critical to consider the long term impact on our environment and local culture.

parked on a
public street
for 72 hrs.
All vehicles
must be
parked in the



same direction of traffic, parked less than 12" from the curb, and vehicles cannot be stored or worked on on a public right of way.

Parked vehicles may not block a driveway, or any emergency vehicle access (including fire hydrants), and may not park in a designated disabled parking area without a displayed permit.

Within the downtown area, most parking areas are limited to 2 hour or 4 hour parking between the hours of 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., with no parking allowed between 2 a.m. - 5 a.m.

Within the downtown area, most parking areas are limited to 2 hour or 4 hour parkin between the hours of 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., with r parking allowed between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m.

Please note, a vehicle must move to a separate city block to avoid a citation. (For example, you may not simply move a vehic across or further down the street).

Residents within the downtown area may apply for a residential parking permit.
