SUBJECT

Second Reading of Ordinance No. 081, 2026, Appropriating Unanticipated Revenue Received Through City Give.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Ordinance, unanimously adopted on First Reading on July 21, 2026, requests an appropriation of \$124,482.46 in philanthropic revenue received through City Give. These miscellaneous gifts to various City departments support a variety of programs and services and are aligned with both the City's strategic priorities and the respective donors' designation.

In 2019, City Give, a formalized enterprise-wide initiative was launched to create a transparent, non-partisan governance structure for the acceptance and appropriations of charitable gifts.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends adoption of the Ordinance on Second Reading.

FIRST READING BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION

The City has long been the beneficiary of local generosity and has a valuable role in our community's philanthropic landscape. Generosity is demonstrated in both large and modest gifts, each appreciated for its investment in the mission and the range of services the City strives to deliver.

The City received several individual philanthropic donations in 2026 totaling \$124,482.46 to support various departments, and these funds are currently unappropriated. Both Section 2.2 of the City's Financial Management Policy 2 – Revenue, as approved by City Council, and the Administrative Philanthropic Governance Policy 6.04, adopted by the City Manager, (together the "City Give Policies"), provide the bases and processes for the responsible and efficient management of charitable donations to the City.

Gifts totaling \$124,482.46 have been received in 2026 for various programs. These gifts include: \$6,560.56 from various individual donors to benefit the Utility Payment Assistance Fund; \$62,500 from Elevations Credit Union to support various recreation events and the Lincoln Center; \$1,500 from the Fort Collins Area Chamber, \$7,500 from Motorola Solutions, and \$2,000 from Haas Alert to support the 2026 Police Leaders Summit; \$14,220 from AARP to benefit Environmental Sustainability; \$3,000 from HSD Law to support Open Streets; and \$27,201.90 from various individual donors to benefit various programs including: Police Services K-9 Unit, Art in Public Places, The Gardens on Spring Creek, and Forestry.

CITY FINANCIAL IMPACTS

Upon adoption, this Ordinance will appropriate in the current fiscal year into the Funds as detailed in the table below in new philanthropic revenue received by City Give in the amount of \$124,482.46 and authorize expenditures against those revenues for the purposes and in the amounts as directed by donors to support various City departments to support a range of programs and services.

The City Manager has also determined that these appropriations are available and previously unappropriated from their designated City Fund and will not cause the total amount appropriated in those Funds to exceed the current estimate of actual and anticipated revenues.
