**WHEREAS**, in 1975, a group of dedicated community leaders in Fort Collins saw the need to establish a community foundation to receive gifts and make impactful grants to improve arts, cultural offerings and peoples experience in the growing community; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lincoln Junior High was converted into the present day Lincoln Center with help from the new Fort Collins Foundation, which contributed more than \$300,000 to its construction; and

**WHEREAS**, over the years the Foundation grew to include five more communities and six more counties and is now known as the NoCo Foundation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Fort Collins Community Fund, made up of donors' gifts specifically meant to improve Fort Collins, has contributed \$5.3 million through more than 1,100 grants to support the nonprofit sector serving its residents and natural environment; and

**WHEREAS,** the NoCo Foundation is celebrating its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2025 and is recognizing the thoughtful generosity and long term investments from individual donors in the communities where we live, such as Fort Collins.
