

RESOLUTION 2026-055
OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT COLLINS
APPOINTING A STAFF MEMBER TO THE LARIMER COUNTY
BEHAVIORAL HEALTH POLICY COUNCIL

A. On November 6, 2018, the voters passed Larimer County Ballot Initiative 1A providing for enhanced mental health services throughout the County.

B. Recognizing that Larimer County residents have diverse needs, the Board of County Commissioners of Larimer County (“Commissioners”) announced the formation of a Behavioral Health Policy Council (the “Policy Council”) to foster regional coordination and cooperation in matters relating to the provision of a continuum of behavioral health services in Larimer County.

C. The Commissioners requested that the mayor of each of the municipalities of Fort Collins, Estes Park, Loveland, and Wellington, or a designated member of the elected body, participate as representatives of those cities on the Policy Council.

D. Due to conflicts with the meeting schedule, no Councilmembers are available for this appointment and the Policy Council has already set the 2026 meeting schedule. The County has allowed an exception to the by-laws for 2026 to appoint a staff member to the Policy Council.

E. The City Council desires to appoint a City staff member to represent the City of Fort Collins on the Policy Council.

In light of the foregoing recitals, which the Council hereby makes and adopts as determinations and findings, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT COLLINS as follows:

Section 1. Jacob Castillo is hereby appointed to attend and serve as the representative for the City of Fort Collins on the Larimer County Behavioral Health Policy Council.

Section 2. This assignment is effective immediately and will remain in effect until Jacob Castillo withdraws from the appointment, or Council has acted to modify this appointment.
