
APP Glenmoor Pond Enhancement Project

The Glenmoor Pond Enhancement Project aims to improve the overall aesthetic, enhance landscaping, add visual interest, and create better pedestrian access and movement


The project team worked with artist Lisa Cameron Russell to create the concept for *Pollinator Salad Days*. Pollinators was the theme for the site and classroom project. The project builds community pride through children's engagement with students from the adjacent Polaris Expeditionary Learning School. The sculptural elements are inspired by the illustrations created during workshops with 2nd grade art students where they learned about public art and drawing images of pollinators. The sculptural elements will be fabricated from weathered steel and will be fastened to an existing guard rail. Complementary whimsical floral imagery by the artist are added to complete the composition and add structural support. The project stretches the length of existing 40' guard rail at Glenmoor Pond, creating a focal point in the space for both pedestrians and motorists on Taft Hill Road.

















Second-grade students from the adjacent Polaris Expeditionary Learning School created imagery of pollinators to be used in the Glenmore Pond Art Project.
