

RESOLUTION 2026-102  
OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT COLLINS  
APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR  
THE CLEAN FLEET VEHICLE AND TECHNOLOGY GRANT  
PROGRAM

A. The City applied for and received the Clean Fleet Vehicle and Technology grant (the "Grant") from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment ("CDPHE"). The Grant provides reimbursement funding in the amount of \$1,806,281 through new vehicle incentives to replace end of life vehicles with Battery Electric or Compressed Natural Gas vehicles. The City was awarded funding for 13 vehicles across all vehicle classifications and matching requirements apply. A copy of the Intergovernmental Grant Agreement ("Grant Agreement") with CDPHE is shown on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

B. The Grant provides funding for vehicle purchases by the following divisions of the City: Streets, Light and Power, Water Utilities, Parks, Forestry, and Operation Services. The Grant also provides funds for required contingency and for scrappage of existing City vehicles. Ordinance No. 100, 2026 appropriates Grant and matching funds for the CDPHE Grant program.

C. City Charter Article II, Section 16 empowers City Council, by ordinance or resolution, to enter contracts with governmental bodies to furnish governmental services and make charges for such services or enter into cooperative or joint activities with other governmental bodies. Section 1-22 of the City Code requires that, with some exceptions, intergovernmental agreements or cooperative activities between the City and other governmental entities be submitted to City Council for review and approval by ordinance or resolution.

In light of the foregoing recitals, which the Council hereby makes and adopts as determinations and findings, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT COLLINS that the City Council approves execution of the Grant Agreement, Exhibit A. The City Manager, after consultation with the City Attorney, is hereby authorized to take any reasonable action necessary to secure the funds offered to the City through options described in the Grant Agreement.
