SUBJECT

First Reading of Ordinance No. 083, 2026, Approving an Intergovernmental Agreement and Appropriating Unanticipated Grant Revenue from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment for the Indoor Radon Grant Program.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this item is to appropriate \$7,793.18 of unanticipated grant revenue from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) for the Indoor Radon Grant Program. The funding will support outreach and educational campaigns to increase radon awareness and provide radon test kits to residents.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends adoption of the Ordinance on First Reading.

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION

In 2026, the City of Fort Collins' Environmental Sustainability Department applied for and was awarded the Indoor Radon Grant through the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division. The goal of the program is to educate the public about the health risks associated with radon, promote testing and mitigation, encourage radon testing, and promote awareness. This is an annual grant through CDPHE.

CITY FINANCIAL IMPACTS

This item appropriates \$7,793.18 of unanticipated grant revenue from Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) for the Indoor Radon Grant program to the general fund. Grant funds will support outreach and educational campaigns to increase radon awareness and provide radon test kits to residents.

The grant is reimbursement-based and does not require local match funding.
