### SUBJECT

**Resolution 2026-098 Approving Two Intergovernmental Agreements with the State of Colorado Relating to Conflict Transformation Works.**

---

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this item is to approve two agreements with the State of Colorado relating to Conflict Transformation Works.

If approved, the Resolution will authorize the City Manager to execute an intergovernmental agreement with the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice for Restorative Justice Services provided by Conflict Transformation Works. The grant will support personnel costs for the Restorative Justice Specialist and the Conflict Transformation Works Program Assistant for their work directly related to the grant funded activities. Council previously appropriated \$35,120 to allow expenditure of these grant funds, through Ordinance No. 064, 2026.

The Resolution also authorizes the City Manager to sign a services agreement with the Colorado Judicial Department Office of the State Court Administrator to provide restorative justice services for adults on probation in the 8th Judicial District. The services will be provided by Conflict Transformation Works. The services agreement establishes per hour and per case rates that the State will pay to the City for the restorative justice services.

### BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION

Grant Agreement: This Colorado Division of Criminal Justice grant helps fund a Restorative Justice Specialist and Program Assistant who support youth referred to the program from the 8th Judicial District Attorney's Office. Restorative Justice is an alternative method of holding a young person accountable by facilitating meeting with the responsible youth, the harmed person/harmed person's representative, and community members to identify the harm caused by the crime and determine how to repair it.

These programs help young people understand the impact of their actions on the harmed person, families, friends, and the community while holding them accountable. By supporting better future decisions, reducing

repeat offenses, and connecting youth and families with appropriate community resources, the program contributes to a safer and healthier community.

Conflict Transformation Works (CTW) and its Restorative Justice programs have provided restorative justice services for referred youth and young adults for 26 years in our community. CTW houses four restorative justice programs and two community mediation programs as well as custom processes that combine both areas of practice.

Services Agreement: In November 2025, CTW responded to a request for qualifications from the State to provide restorative justice services for adults on probation with the 8<sup>th</sup> Judicial District. CTW's bid was approved by the State as a service provider and has since then been negotiating the contract with the State to provide these services.

The services will be paid for through invoicing per an agreed upon rate.

### **CITY FINANCIAL IMPACTS**

The Grant was previously appropriated under Ordinance No. 064, 2026. No additional appropriation is requested currently, though funds received under the services agreement will be brought to Council for appropriation in the future.
