SUBJECT

Second Reading of Ordinance No. 106, 2026, Making a Supplemental Appropriation of Grant Funds from the Colorado State Patrol for the Beat Auto Theft Through Law Enforcement Grant Program.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Ordinance, unanimously adopted on First Reading on August 18, 2026, appropriates \$26,860 of unanticipated grant revenue from the Colorado State Patrol ("CSP") for the Beat Auto Theft Through Law Enforcement ("BATTLE") grant program. The funding will support Police Services personnel overtime pay to support multiagency and multijurisdictional BATTLE operations to identify, interdict, investigate, enforce, and prosecute motor vehicle theft-related crimes.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends adoption of the Ordinance on Second Reading.

FIRST READING BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION

The BATTLE program is comprised of several regions throughout Colorado, including the BATTLE North Region. Fort Collins Police Services ("FCPS"), in capacity as a partner agency to the BATTLE North team, collaborates with other partner agencies to respond to motor vehicle theft-related crimes. The \$26,860 in BATTLE program funds will be used to support FCPS's Property Crimes Unit to prevent auto theft crimes and to cover overtime pay for FCPS personnel.

CITY FINANCIAL IMPACTS

This item appropriates \$26,860 of unanticipated grant revenue from the CSP BATTLE grant program. Grant funds will be used to support FCPS personnel overtime pay to support multiagency and multijurisdictional BATTLE operations to identify, interdict, investigate, enforce, and prosecute motor vehicle theft-related crimes.

The grant is reimbursement-based and does not require local match funding.
